### Graduate Student Representative Referendum

Currently there are no graduate student positions in the Texas A&M Student Senate. The Student Senate has resolved that graduate students should have the opportunity for representation within student government. Therefore, as a graduate student at Texas A&M, do you support the establishment of a bicameral student congress that shall include a graduate senate in addition to the current undergraduate senate.

### Special Events Center Referendum

Our present coliseum, G. Rollie White, was built in 1954. It contains only 7,000 seats and is not equipped to handle the entertainment needs of a major university. The construction of a modern 12,500 seat Special Events Center would allow for the presentations of rock concerts, ice shows and other special arena shows as well as basketball games, graduation ceremonies and Muster.

### Student Center Usage Fee Referendum

The Student Center Usage Fee is currently \$20/semester and \$10/summer session. The University Center has expanded and costs have increased due to both the additional space and inflation. This fee has not increased since 1986.

It is proposed that the Student Center Usage Fee be increased to \$4/semester and \$2/summer session for the Fiscal Year 1993.
