Blair said although Stockdale is not a politician, he would make a good one

"I would like to staff a government with people like him," he said.

When asked if he thought Perot stood a chance at the White House, Blair said he was not sure.

"If Mr. Perot doesn't make it, he will definitely make enough of an impression to possibly be courted by either the Republican or Democratic party in 1996," he said

Blair said it is hard to figure out a man like Perot.

'I'm not sure a man of Perot's type, a self-made businessman, will have the temperament of a compromiser," he said. "But it's refreshing to have someone with his ideas

Perot will make a final decision on his running mate this summer. Blair said Stockdale would be the best selection if Perot decides to run for president.

"He's a real philosopher and you know exactly where you stand with him," he said. "If I had to pick a running man, I'd pick him (Stockdale).
