Activist asks utility commissioner to resign

AUSTIN (AP) — A consumer activist called for Public Utility Commissioner Paul Meek's resignation or ouster Wednesday, after a flap as the PUC looked at a proposal to delete a utility reporting requirement on lobbying expenses

Meek, who has previously been targeted by callers asking for his resignation, said he will not step down

The PUC voted 2-1 to publish for public comment the proposed rule change, which would eliminate a requirement that electric and telephone companies detail annually at the PUC their spending on lobbying, business gifts

Psychiatrist explains feelings for patient

BOSTON (AP) – A psychiatrist accused of having sex with a patient who later apparently committed suicide told colleagues that she had erotic feelings toward the young man, according to an affidavit.

"Dr. Margaret Bean-Bayog lked about her erotic sexual feelings toward a Mexican-American medical student, said the affidavit, filed in Middlesex Superior Court on Wednesday by Cambridge psychotherapist Amy Stromsten. "Dr. Bean-Bayog described how powerful and strong her feel-ings were toward Paul Lozano in great length." Lozano, 28, a Harvard medical student, sought counseling with Bean-Bayog for depression from 1986 to 1990. His family contends Bean-Bayog lured him into a sexual relationship and that he committed suicide in April 1991 after she ended their therapy. Lozano's family in El Paso has filed malpractice and wrongful death suits against Bean-Bayog. Bean-Bayog has denied hav-

ing sex with Lozano or mistreating him, and said his death was accidental. She also said she never devi-

ated from established medical practices in treating Lozano, who she described as severely mentally ill.





The nine-day atmospheric search expedition - the first in shuttle flights – was due to m with a 6:23 a.m. Thursday land at Kennedy Space Center. Go weather was forecast.

Scientists were thrilled with the surplus data. The bonus data benefited investigators of 11 the 13 scientific instrument aboard Atlantis. Two instrume - an electron beam gun and a ultraviolet telescope - are in erable because of blown fuses.

"We are just delighted. We measured things we have m measured before," said mission scientist Marsha Torr. "It's goin to be a true reference data bas that we will use for many, many years to come.'

Atlantis' flight is the first perhaps 10 atmospheric laborati ry missions planned for the net decade. Scientists want to me sure Earth's endangered ozo layer and other parts of the atm sphere during an 11-year solar cle, the period from one peaks lar activity to the next.

Program scientist Jack Kare said the Atlantis flight will be
