The seven-mile hike on Highway 60 from campus to the river began at 8 a.m.

Once at the river, about 1,700 cadets participated in field events like relay races and tug-of-war.

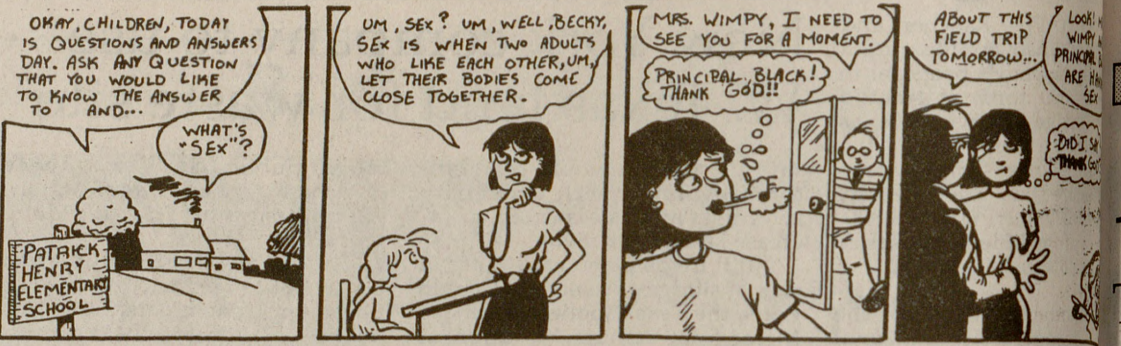
In addition, the Rudder's

"Everything went really well this year," Shelton said. "The committee really appreciates the support the community gave us both through financial donations and prize incentives."

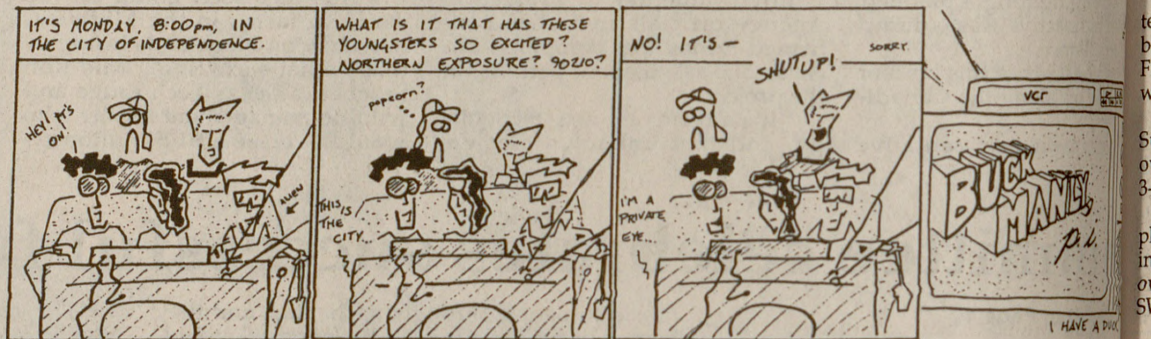

Supporters collect signatures for candidate Volunteers race to get Perot on ballot

WASHINGTON (AP) — From coast to coast, an enthusiastic volunteer army is on the march to get Texas billionaire Ross Perot on the presidential ballot in November. Judging by early reports from recruits, the goal may be met in short order.

"It's a wildfire," said organizer Michele Kubek of Anchorage, Alaska, who expects to round up the more than 2,000 signatures her state requires in a matter of days. "The phone rang all day yesterday" with questions about Perot, said Patsy Casey, a worker in the secretary of state's office in Kentucky. In Las Vegas, an organizer reported gathering 300 signatures on a busy street corner in just two hours.

Interviews by The Associated Press with election officials and volunteers in all 50 states over the

past week show that response to a prospective Perot candidacy has been swift and overwhelming.

Perot, with a net worth of over \$2 billion, started the ball rolling last month by saying he would run as an independent if people could get his name on the ballot in all 50 states.

With the outspoken industrialist and his employees prodding the process from Dallas — and with the help of a high-tech 800-number — the Perot petition effort has been barreling along.

"This has been the most incredible groundswell — just ordinary folks coming out of the woodwork," said Barbara LeBey, a former Georgia judge who is an Atlanta organizer.

Perot needs 27,000 signatures by July 14 to get on Georgia's ballot. Organizers say they will shoot for 60,000 just to be safe.

The Texas industrialist says if he runs, he will foot the bill himself — and is prepared to spend \$100 million — making a Perot candidacy unparalleled.

"Any time someone can spend \$100 million on a campaign and is

worth \$2 billion, damn sure you're concerned," said William Ulrey, executive director of the New Jersey Republican State Committee.

"This is the first time we had a third-party candidate who the wherewithal to mount a serious campaign for the presidency," said Ted Thomas, owner of a Portland, Ore., computer software company, who is putting in 100 hours to get Perot on his state ballot.

Thomas says it will not be long to collect the necessary 34,000 signatures by an August 25 deadline. "There's a tremendous amount of interest in this," he said.

In the past three weeks, 15 million people have called the 800-number — which rings in either Dallas or Tampa, Fla. — offering to circulate petitions, said Sharon Holman, a Perot employee who helps oversee the petition bank.

Some 101,000 calls came in last Monday alone, the day Perot named former retired Vice Adm. James Stockdale, as his interim running mate.

Voters boost far-rightists in German elections

STUTTGART, Germany (AP) — Voters in two states gave strong boosts to extreme rightists Sunday after legislative campaigns that focused on Germany's growing immigrant population.

Chancellor Helmut Kohl's Christian Democrats lost their absolute control of the southwest state of Baden-Wuerttemberg, but the makeup of a governing coalition was unclear. No combination of parties with the necessary majority of the 146-seat parliament was immediately evident.

In the northern state of Schleswig-Holstein, the governing Social Democrats barely held onto their majority in parliament.

In both states, right-wing parties finished third, behind either the conservative Christian Democrats or the left-leaning Social Democrats.

The results were based on an official count of all votes cast in the two states. A final count

will be released in a few days, although it was not expected to differ.

Kohl's party took 39 percent of the Baden-Wuerttemberg vote, compared to 49 percent in the last elections in 1988, the results showed.

The Social Democrats finished second with 29 percent compared to 32 percent four years ago.

The far-right Republicans, who campaigned on a strong anti-foreigner platform that blamed immigrants for housing shortages, budget problems, inflation, crime and growing joblessness, came in third.

They won nearly 11 percent of the vote.

Four years ago, the Republicans won only 1 percent, and national opinion polls usually give the far right only 2 percent support.

Parties must have 5 percent of the vote for parliamentary representation.

Violence escalates in Bosnia

BELGRADE, Yugoslavia (AP) — Snipers fired on peace demonstrators, and Serb militiamen assaulted a police academy as violence surged Sunday in Bosnia-Herzegovina.

The attacks came the day before the European Community was to consider recognizing the republic's independence, the main issue inspiring the violence.

The Tanjug news agency also reported the resignation Sunday of Bosnia's Premier Jure Plevinac, an ethnic Croat. No reason was given.

At least eight people were killed and 30 wounded Sunday in the Bosnian capital, Sarajevo, said Sabina Cabaravdic, an editor at Radio Sarajevo.

Leaders of the republic's three main communities — Croats, Serbs and Muslims — agreed to call for a cease-fire. They and the federal military commander in Bosnia appeared on television as commentators read their appeal.
