

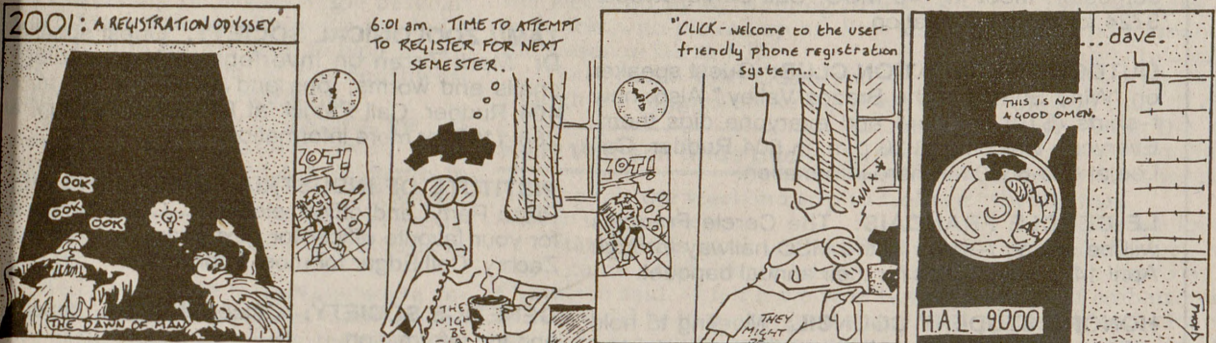

Catholic Church picks Denver for conference

A U.S. bishop's statement said Denver was an "attractive" location for Hispanics in the southwestern United States and Central America. Surveys indicate the U.S. Catholic Church will be 50 percent Hispanic by 2020.

Denver has about 275,000 Hispanics, the largest population of the three cities considered for the conference.

Its Catholic population is estimated at 330,000.

Gov. Roy Romer heralded Colorado's victory at a news conference with Denver Archbishop J. Francis Stafford.

"Ultimately, matters of the spirit do shape our values whether privately or governmentally," Romer told the crowd of about 100.

In New York, Bishop Edward D. Head of the Diocese of Buffalo said he was disappointed the city was not selected, but pleased it was a finalist.

had to wear until the middle of January."

The tube was removed and a couple of stitches on the side of her rib cage fixed her up, and since then, there has been no sign of the cyst.

Caldwell went back to Minnesota every six months for the first two years to monitor for signs of her body rejecting her sister's pancreas.

Both women are fine now, and Prihoda said Caldwell is a totally different person.

"She wouldn't have lived," Prihoda said. "She had about six months to live if we hadn't gotten the transplant."

Caldwell said she has not been admitted to the hospital since the transplant.

"I have had such a remarkable three years and it has made my marriage and my children so much happier," she said.

But millions of Americans are not as lucky as Prihoda and Caldwell.

Diabetics have to take shots daily to provide their bodies with insulin not being produced naturally.

Caldwell and Prihoda both are healthy, but now are worried because their brother has diabetes and the waiting list for organs is so long.

"There are so many people that need organs," Caldwell said.

"It is sad that when people die, they won't give their organs to save another — a pancreas could be so helpful to someone."
