disagree with the idea of castrashe says. "It's fine and dandy, but it's not relevant to the issue at hand. The sex drive may be gone, but the anger is still

The primary catalyst for a sexual assault is anger towards women and a rapist's need to control and humiliate, Castoria says.

Sometimes rapists will target particular age groups, such as the elderly or children, she says. This typically relates back to the rapist's childhood and a specific person such as a grandmother who hurt the rapist either physically or mentally.

Pedophiles, or child molesters, were probably victims of sexual abuse in their early years as well, says Castoria.

One problem with analyzing rapists is that most rapists do not exhibit certain characteristics in everyday life. The urge is so strong that if

you're in the wrong place at the wrong time, you will become his victim," Castoria says. "It's just being overwhelmed with anger at a specific time.' Gary Walker, division head of the law enforcement training de-

partment at Texas A&M, agrees

with Castoria in that there is no single kind of behavior that rapists exhibit. "There are all kinds of looneytune dudes out there with no specific behavior pattern," says Walker. "They could be introverted or
