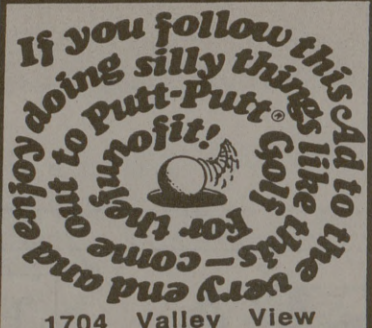

Spurs run past Mavs, 120-108

SAN ANTONIO (AP) — Sean Elliott scored 26 points and Terry Cummings added 23 as the San Antonio Spurs beat the Dallas Mavericks 120-108 Tuesday at HemisFair Arena.

The Spurs are 46-33 for the season and 30-9 at home. San Antonio beat the Mavericks (20-59) for the fifth straight time this season and also won its 14th of 16 home games.

San Antonio is 19-4 at home with Coach Bob Bass. The Spurs took a 17-point lead, 23-6, on a layup by Donald Royal with 5:45 left in the first period.

The Spurs outscored the Mavs 23-6 to that point. Elliott accounted for eight of those points and Rod Strickland, who finished the game with 21 points, had six.

In the second period, the Spurs widened their lead to 25 points, 59-34, the largest of the game on a layup by Vinnie Johnson at 2:12.

Doug Smith of the Mavs brought Dallas to within nine, 109-100, by two free throws at 2:49 in the game. Dallas outscored San Antonio 12-8 from the beginning of the fourth quarter. But Donald Royal, who finished the game with a season-high 18 points, dropped in a layup as San Antonio led 114-102.

Antoine Carr was the fifth San Antonio player in double figures, with 13. Strickland also completed the contest with 14 assists.

The Mavs were paced by Rolando Blackman who had 20 points. Rodney McCray added 18 points and Donald Hodge had 14.

Mike Iuzzolino and Randy White each added 11 points for Dallas while Tracy Moore and Doug Smith each had 10.

San Antonio shot 44.7 percent from the field (42 of 88) and 73.5 percent at the free throw line (36 of 50).

Although the Lady Aggies scored only five runs, Brock said the team is on the edge of having some big innings.

"Our hitting is almost like the baseball team," he said. "We just don't seem to get a hit at the right time. We've got to work on some timely hits and we're looking forward to play this weekend."

Rangers fall again to Angels

ARLINGTON (AP) — Hubie Brooks had a three-run homer and five RBIs Tuesday night as the California Angels won their fourth straight, 8-1 over the Texas Rangers.

Brooks hit the first pitch to him by starter Jeff Robinson into the left field stands for his second homer of the season, staking starter Joe Grahe to a 3-0 lead.

Grahe yielded four hits in 6 2-3 innings against the most potent lineup in the major leagues. Grahe, 3-7 with a 4.81 ERA last season, entered the game with a 12.60 ERA in his only start this year.

With staff ace Chuck Finley on the disabled list and Mark Langston slowed by a hip injury, the Angels needed an effective start from Grahe. He retired 11 consecutive batters at one point.

Overall, he walked two and struck out four.

He left with two outs in the seventh after diving to catch a line drive by pinch hitter Geno Petralli. Grahe spared the shot, then threw to first from a seated position to double up Dickie Thon. Grahe's overthrow allowed Kevin Reimer and Thon to advance to third and second.

Grahe, who bruised an index finger on his right hand but was not seriously injured, was replaced by Chuck Crim after the play. And Thon, who never tagged up on the line drive, was ruled out on an appeal play at first.

Texas, which dropped its second straight after opening the season 6-1, entered the game leading the majors in runs with 53.

Rockets stop Trail Blazers

HOUSTON (AP) — Otis Thorpe made 11 of 12 shots and scored 24 points, leading Houston to a foul-filled 108-96 victory Tuesday night over the Portland Trail Blazers that kept the Rockets' playoff hopes alive.

The Rockets took a half-game lead over the Los Angeles Lakers in the race for the eighth and final Western Conference playoff spot.

Vernon Maxwell scored 10 straight Houston points, keeping the Rockets ahead 81-75 going into the final period. He finished with 22 points and Kevin Duckworth led the Trail Blazers with 21.

Portland pulled within four points with 6:12 to go, but Thorpe's basket and two by Sleepy Floyd allowed the Rockets to widen the lead.

Houston's Hakeem Olajuwon fouled out of the game with 42 seconds to play, leaving the game with five foul shots for the Trail Blazers.

Portland's Buck Williams who battled with Thorpe throughout the game, fouled out with 2:14 to play.

Houston held a 51-41 time lead and a nine-point margin midway through the quarter when the Trail Blazers pulled to 69-65 with 3:13 to go.

Clyde Drexler sat out the game for Portland with a sprained knee. Also out was Jerome Kersey, but the Trail Blazers did not disclose the nature of his injury. The Trail Blazers clinched their second straight Pacific Division title with a 123-97 victory over the San Antonio Spurs on Sunday.

especially after losing a starter and a backup middle linebacker to Plan B free agency. Now that Jack Del Rio and Darrick Brownlow are no longer with the Cowboys, the team's starting middle linebacker is former Miami Hurricane Bernard Clark.

So it still looks like Billy Cannon Jr. will be the last Aggie linebacker the Cowboys draft. While the Cowboys might be out of the Corvatt sweepstakes, they still have a chance at Smith. It seems like a match almost too good to be true.

While the Cowboys made it to the playoffs last year, they still have some major weaknesses, the secondary being one of them.

Two years ago, this wouldn't have been the situation. It seemed like Ike Holt was an up and coming cornerback. Last season, he looked like he was a down and out corner. He, along with former TCU corner Larry Brown did a satisfactory job, but they both don't have positions guaranteed when the Cowboys go to training camp.

Smith could be the answer. It seems that there are a lot of good corners available come draft day including Wisconsin's Troy Vincent and Florida State's Terrell Buckley. But Smith might be the best of the three.

Like Vincent, Smith can return punts, something the Cowboys can definitely use. But Smith has had more corner back experience.

Vincent plays in the run-oriented Big Ten while Smith played against the likes of David Klingler and Andre Ware.

When you think of Buckley you think of his mouth. That alone makes Smith a better prospect than Buckley.

Smith has said he would like to stay in Texas for his professional career. He doubts the Houston Oilers would take him.

The Cowboys own two first round picks so it seems like they could grab Smith if they really wanted him. He could help them immediately as could Corvatt, but it seems unlikely that the linebacker will be around.

Maybe the Cowboys could make up for not getting Corvatt by drafting the rest of the available Aggies.
