





The last time anyone remembers

seeing him, Capt. Byron Stone was blasting a Browning automatic rifle into the coconut trees. First Lt. William D.H. Ragin had grabbed a machine gun from a dead Vietnamese crew and was firing point blank at about 60 advancing Viet Cong guerrillas who, a few minutes earlier, had been mistaken for government reinforcements.

Sgt. Tom Ward was facing destiny somewhere further away with a Ranger company he was advising. And First Lt. James Coyle was pumping bullets at the enemy with a carbine.

Then a bullet spun Coyle to the ground. Stone, who was nearby, appeared to be about to run to his aid.

that overwhelmed and routed a government Ranger and infantry unit and inflicted 206 casualties.

The last time Maj. James McKnight saw Stone was March 1964, when he left Quang-Tri, South Vietnam. In February 1965 McKnight, who had been Byron's commanding officer since March 1963, presented the Distinguished Service Cross - one of the nation's highest military honors - to Stone's parents.

The citation accompanying the medal reads: "Undaunted by extremely heavy enemy gunfire, Capt. Stone completely disregarded his own safety and bravely exposed himself to the full force of violent enemy attack to cover the withdrawal of friendly troops.

"He demonstrated fortitude

Stone's name is among th on the Vietnam Memorial in fro of Duncan Dining Hall. The me ories and medals of heroes are forgotten corners of our min and attics.

Stone is listed among the main men he died with - four nar among more than 50,000 on Vietnam Memorial in Washi ton, D.C. His grave marker is of many more thousands in. lington Cemetery.
