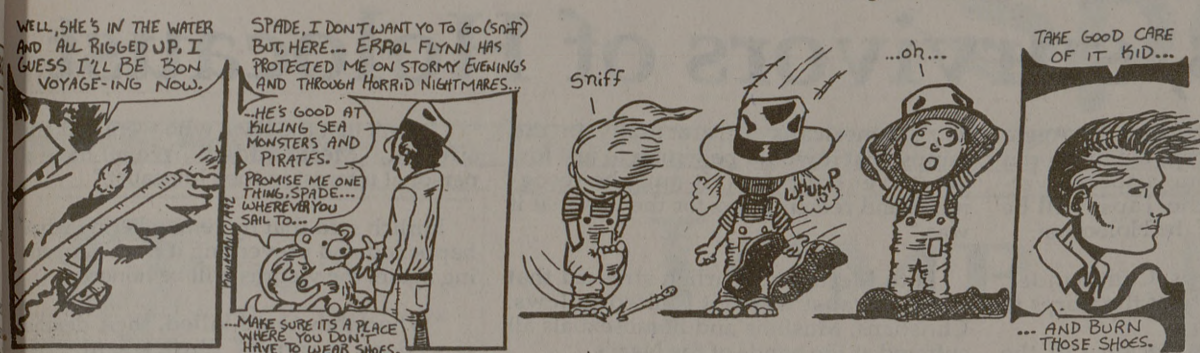


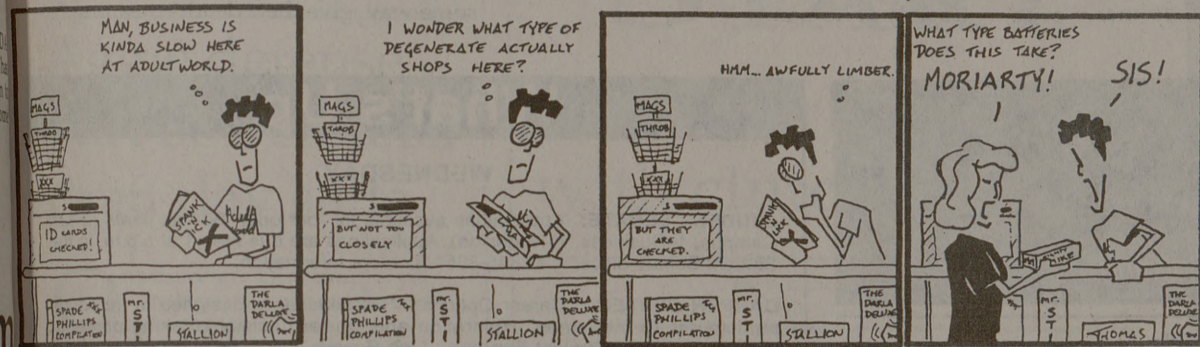

Police Beat

Misdemeanor Theft

Felony Theft

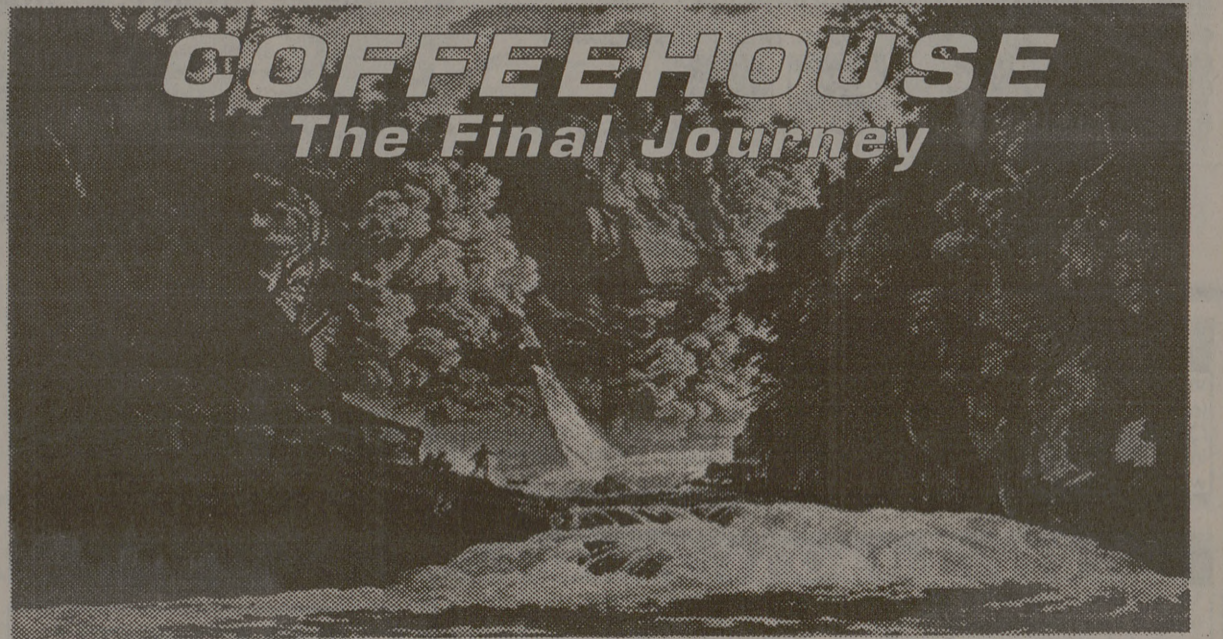
Rudder Tower loading docks — An aluminum tool case containing an assortment of electronic equipment and electrical tools was stolen.
