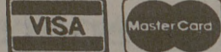

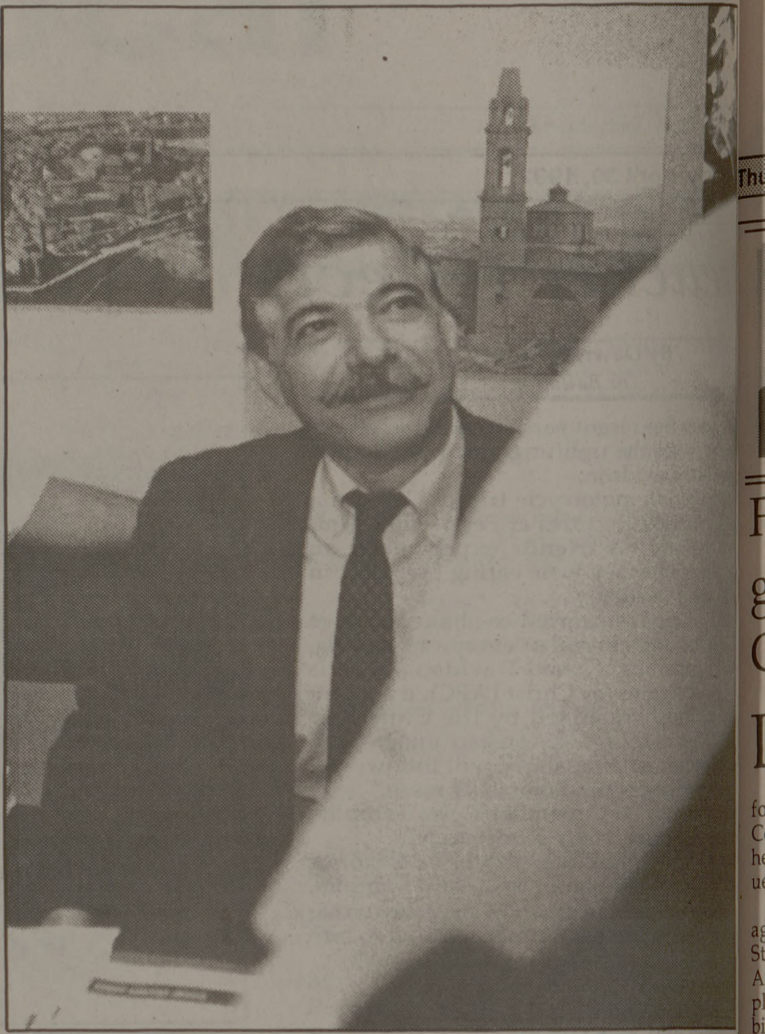

History professor chronicles plight of German prisoners

German soldiers. His research eventually led to a book, "Nazi War Prisoners in America."

In 1984, a man called Kramer and said he enjoyed "Nazi War Prisoners" because it was so accurate. As the conversation progressed, the man admitted he was George Gartner, the last uncaptured German soldier in America.

Gartner escaped from a prison camp and successfully eluded officials for 40 years. He was living in Houston under a different name when he read Kramer's book.

Interestingly, Gartner played professional tennis for a number of years, and not even his wife knew about his secret past. After his story became public, officials took no actions against him.

Kramer is currently working on his fourth book about the enemy alien program, which concerned the internment of Germans during World War II.

"Everybody knows we rounded up about 115,000 Japanese during World War II," he said. "But few people know we also rounded up about 31,000 Germans. One of the biggest camps was Crystal City near Uvalde, Texas."

Oddly, many German prisoners may have been treated better than German-born American citizens. In "Nazi War Prisoners," Kramer detailed the lives of German soldiers who were kept in

American prison camps.

"Many of them remember their experiences as some of the greatest of their lives," he said. "They were out of the fighting, they were better than in their own army, they took correspondence courses. Many of them went home with credits from Texas universities, including Texas A&M."

One of the biggest camps was in Hearne, just a few miles from Bryan down Highway 6. Between 5,000 and 8,000 prisoners were housed there during the war.

"People would refer to the camp as the 'Fritz Ritz,'" he said. Because of rationing and economics, sometimes the prisoners were able to eat better than people in the town.

"They were all treated well," Kramer said. "We thought they took care of theirs, they would take care of ours."

Last summer Kramer unexpectedly passed out in German during one of his study abroad classes. Later it was determined he had an aneurysm in his brain which was operated on last summer. He had to miss class all day during his recovery.

"In the hospital you do a hell of a soul-searching, you cut deals with God," he said. "One of the things concluded is that I'm doing exactly what I want to do and exactly where I want to do it. It's such a great feeling..."
