Good fishing beats finals blues

down and final exams looming ever so ominously, new ways to procrastinate are always in high demand. If you've never tried fishing during finals, give it a shot.

The spawn has been over in most area lakes for some time now, and the fish are starting to fall into a summer/warm weather pattern. This means that fish are going to be found feeding in deep water as the temperature warms and the days become hot.

A good bet for deep water fishing in this warmer weather is a Texas-rigged worm fished using a medium-speed retrieve. Start by using a small four-inch worm before you try something larger, and use a small bullet weight no heavier than a quarter of an ounce.

When choosing a color, I like to try several different colors and decide after I have landed several fish. Firecracker (clear with red and blue fleck and a blue tail) seems to be a better than average color this time of year, and tequila sunrise may also draw more

The metabolism of the fish has sped up since the spawn, and if they're hungry, they are going to

Also, look for schooling fish feeding on the surface, and take full advantage of the situation. On a trip to Bryan Utilities Lake last weekend, a Zara puppy landed a healthy three pounder, which is a trophy by that lake's standards. The trip also yielded several smaller fish caught on anything

So, if you're looking to find a way to get out of studying besides cleaning the entire apartment or washing and waxing your car, grab your rod and reel and do battle with one of nature's finest, a largemouth bass.

On the saltwater scene, many students will get the opportunity to fish Texas bays and even offshore in the Gulf of Mexico this summer.

For saltwater, the summer means tournament time, and most people automatically picture elaborate billfish tournaments like the Poco Bueno in Port 'O Connor or the Deep Sea Roundup in Port Aransas. Fortunately, these highdollar affairs are not the only tournaments around.

The Gulf Coast Conservation Association (GCCA) is holding the summer-long State of Texas Angler's Rodeo (S.T.A.R.). The tournament is designed not only to offer a tournament setting where huge fish will be weighed and entire boats, motors and trailers will be given away, but also the chance to become a member of the

The entry fee allows the fisherman in the tournament, which lasts from Memorial Day weekend, May 23, until Labor Day, Sept. 7, and provides the entrant with a membership in the GCCA

A boat, motor and trailer will be awarded for the largest fish in the following divisions: speckled trout for the upper, middle and lower coasts, flounder, gafftop, sheepshead, dorado (dolphin but not the mammal) and king mack-

In addition to the largest fish in each division, 60 tagged redfish will be released along the coast from Port Arthur to Port Isabel and the first ten caught will be worth a boat, motor and trailer. Since the tournament runs the

entire length of the summer, there is little pressure to fish under the stress of a typical tournament setting. But with the number of anglers who will take part, the chances of winning are not as good as they could be.

However, you never know when you may have a little luck and hook up with one of those tagged redfish worth a 22-foot Redfin and 115 horsepower

It happened twice during last year's tournament to anglers who had failed to enter.

Even if the S.T.A.R does add stress to your day of fishing, just remember that your worst day fishing is still better than your best day of work (or school as is our
