The best movies you never saw

For those brave souls who would dare stray from the comfort zone of the "New Releases" rack at the video rental store, the ensuing list is a treasure chest of films that will make you laugh, make you cry, make you fall in love with this reviewer. If you want to enjoy films that are experiences, not just movies, then dare to be different.

Gallipoli Mel Gibson and director Peter Weir, despite stellar careers, were never better than in this epic of the Australian Expeditionary Forces fighting a desperately heroic yet unwinnable battle against the Turks during World War I. The Lighthorsemen
