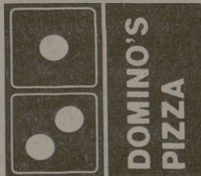

Fischer, Spassky end second game in draw

SVETI STEFAN, Yugoslavia (AP) — Bobby Fischer battled Boris Spassky to a draw Thursday in the second game of their \$5 million rematch that marked Fischer's return to the game after 20 years.

Fischer fought back after a strong start by Spassky, but finally offered the draw after the 59th move by his old rival and after seven hours of tense, exhausting play.

Under the rules of the match, draws do not count for points, leaving the score 1-0, after Fischer's convincing opening victory in a six-hour contest Wednesday. The contest is being held in this elegant Adriatic sea resort in defiance of U.N. sanctions against Yugoslavia.

Their next game is Saturday. Fischer, 49, gave credit Thursday to his old opponent, the same

man he defeated in 1972 to become America's first and only chess world champion.

"Boris had a good game, but then he made a few slips," Fischer said. "I had a winning chance... the end is a clear draw."

Spassky, a 55-year-old Russian now a French citizen, conceded he simply "played badly" in the middle of the game.

Spassky played white and opened the game at 3:30 p.m. with the Samisch variation. Fischer adopted the King's Indian defense to appreciative "oohs" from the audience.

Given Spassky's early positional advantage, chess experts were impressed by the strength of Fischer's middle game. Some said it came close to beating Spassky outright.

"Fischer's not much worse than he used to be — that means he's one of the best in the world," Icelandic grandmaster Meig Petursson said.

Officials confirm 'killer bee' attack, instigate restrictions

AUSTIN — State officials are confirming that the bees which stung John Jandt and his dog, Blue, last month in Seguin were Africanized honeybees, the so-called "killer bees."

Because of the finding, the state has extended to Guadalupe County and its southern neighbor, Wilson County, a quarantine restricting the movement of commercial bee operations.

That quarantine now covers 37 Texas counties.

Jandt's sister, Guadalupe County Attorney Elizabeth Jandt, said that on Aug. 22, her brother was on a riding lawn mower, cutting grass in his yard, when bees began pouring out of a previously undetected hive in a mesquite stump.

"He probably got 25-plus stings. His dog got it worse," said Ms. Jandt, who came running when she heard her brother's shouts.

The bees chased Jandt to a back door of his house. When he got inside, they swarmed on the

screen. He tried to go out another back door, but "they were waiting at the other back door and the front door," his sister said.

Meanwhile, in a backyard pet Blue, a 140-pound Great Dane was fighting his own battle with the bees.

"He just like to went crazy. He'd dug out of his pen," Ms. Jandt said. "The dog must have gotten between 100 and 200 welts."

The dog now "is doing OK. He's got one eye that's still puffy," she said.

Her brother also recovered. Ms. Jandt said she received a half dozen stings.

A sample of the bees was analyzed at the Honey Bee Identification Lab at Texas A&M University and later by the U.S. Department of Agriculture.

Texas A&M officials notified the family this week that the insects were killer bees, Ms. Jandt said Wednesday.

Although the hive has been destroyed, she said, "I'm sure there are more around."
