"Nobody wants to go into east Germany," said Charles Baubeng, a 29-year-old Ghanian who arrived in Munich two months ago, then was sent to a refugee home in the east German city of Breitenheerda.

'The violence is bad. But the other parts . . . the way people here look at you and talk to you.

They hate Africans," he said. The idea that has drawn the most debate, however, is tighten-ing Germany's liberal asylum law and reducing the number of refugees across the entire nation. Chancellor Helmut Kohl's


