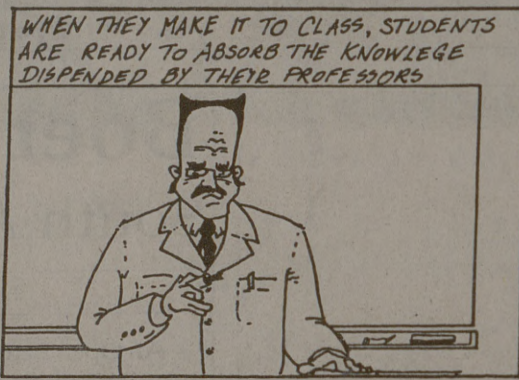

bleeding, he said. "It all happened very quickly," Doyle said. The man, whose name has been withheld at his request, received the historic transplant during an 11-hour operation on June 28. He suffered from hepatitis B, which was destroying his own liver and likely would have attacked any transplanted human liver, doctors said. Until the last week of August he appeared to be recovering well from surgery. On July 3, doctors upgraded his condition to serious, and then to fair on July 28. He suffered a minor bout with rejection in mid-July but doctors quickly controlled it with steroids. The man's condition started to slide on or about Aug. 25, when fever sent him back to the hospital's intensive-care unit. Within a week, his condition had been downgraded twice, critical, and since Tuesday he has been on a respirator because of an infection that impaired his liver function. High doses of antibiotics kept the infection from getting worse but failed to cure it. Doctors believe the man developed sepsis, a blood infection, after dye was injected into his blood Aug. 28 for an X-ray, possibly introducing a bacteria. Physicians also speculated he may have experienced some unknown form of organ rejection, although a biopsy taken Aug. 28 showed no sign that the liver was being rejected.

"Nobody wants to go into east Germany," said Charles Bauberg, a 29-year-old Ghanian who arrived in Munich two months ago, then was sent to a refugee home in the east German city of Breitenheerda. "The violence is bad. But the other parts... the way people here look at you and talk to you. They hate Africans," he said. The idea that has drawn the most debate, however, is tightening Germany's liberal asylum law and reducing the number of refugees across the entire nation. Chancellor Helmut Kohl's Christian Democrats are fighting to change the constitution, which now lets everyone who utters the word "asylum" stay in the country until their applications are processed, which takes about a year. A constitutional change would require the support of the left-leaning Social Democrats, who is waging an internal struggle over the idea. In a weekend vote of the Social Democrat lawmakers in Hesse state, a proposal to support tougher asylum law was narrowly defeated, 161-133. Another prominent Social Democrat, Munich Mayor Georg Kronawitter, said in an interview in this week's edition of the magazine Der Spiegel that he favored quotas for specific states that have "too many" refugees of one nationality.
