here at all," she replied.
 Among the specifics, the pact:
 - Establishes a free trade commission, composed of cabinet-level officials from each country, to supervise the implementation of the agreement and resolve disputes. The panel also will supervise the work of the eight committees and six working groups created under the agreement.
 - Allows for withdrawal from the agreement six months after one of the countries pro-

vides written notice to the other countries. If one of the three nations withdraws, the agreement remains in effect for the other two.
 - Contains an accession clause that would allow other countries to join the agreement provided that the United States, Mexico and Canada jointly agree. The Bush administration already has indicated it plans to negotiate a free trade agreement with Chile, which could join the NAFTA.
 - Will not erode the rights Mexico now grants to maquiladoras, the American-owned assembly plants operating near the border in Mexico. The maquiladoras import raw materials duty-free, assemble them in Mexico, then ship them back to the United States for export.
 - Eliminates taxes and duties on the export

of energy or petrochemical products unless exporting nation levies the same tax or for its domestic consumption. Mexico, constitutionally protects its energy industry maintains all rights to the exploration, production and refining of crude oil and natural gas in Mexico.
 - Does not bar the three nations from weakening their safety and environmental laws to lure investments nor does it require them to equalize such protections. But three countries agreed that "it is inappropriate to encourage investment by relaxing domestic health, safety and environmental measures one country thinks another has done this, permitted to "consult" with the supposed offending country.

The ANC did not call for the removal of Maj. Gen. Bantu Holomisa, military ruler of the Transkei homeland, who is allied to the ANC.
 The ANC considers the homelands illegitimate creations of the apartheid system and wants them reincorporated into South Africa.
 Mandela called for an independent investigation into the killings.
 "Gqozo is not going to last, I can tell you," Mandela later told thousands of cheering supporters at a rally in King William's Town, just inside South Africa. "We will not rest until Gqozo is removed."

 As Gore told the crowd strong environmental laws were important for future generations, an anti-abortion protester interrupted and called him a hypocrite.
 "I believe there is a difference between giving a woman the right to choose and being in favor of abortion," Gore said in response. "Bill Clinton and I are not pro-abortion. We believe abortions can be reduced by reducing the num-

ber of unwanted pregnancies."
 Gore won large applause when he said education reform should include good nutrition programs, good preventative health care, family leave programs and child care.
 One girl told Gore her sister lost many welfare benefits and rent on her low-income housing went up when she went to work at a minimum wage job.

er because they sold out," Enoch said. "And Mauzy is one of those judges."
 Enoch said that his election to the court would send a message to lawmakers that judges cannot be bought and sold in Texas, and his judicial restraint would restore the court to a non-activist, true, judicial branch.
 "I believe I fit the people's definition of what a judge is," Enoch said. "I'm a referee; an umpire - Oscar Mauzy is a legislator."

Enoch accuses Mauzy of appealing to the cynical side of judicial politics and trying to accomplish as a judge what he could not accomplish during his 20-year stint in the state senate.
 Enoch is a 1975 graduate of the Southern Methodist University Law School. He received his master's degree in judicial process from the University of Virginia School of Law and worked as a lawyer in Dallas until being appointed as a judge to the 101st District Court in Dallas.
 He has received endorsements from major newspapers and organizations across the state, and has consistently outperformed Mauzy in polls and district primaries.
 "I'm a judge - that's all I've ever been."

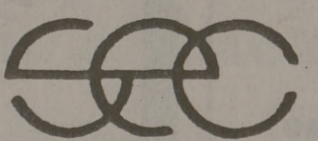
