Greyhound bus drivers stay on strike

CHARLESTON, W.Va. - Labor Day was not a holiday for striking Greyhound bus drivers who have been off the job for 2 1/2 years.

Union members gathered Monday at the Charleston Greyhound station for their third Labor Day "We're celebrating a labor holi-

day but that doesn't mean anything to corporate America," said Rodney Lambert, a member of the Amalgamated Transit Union Lo-

'The Constitution says we have the right to life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness. But when you can't feed your kids, you don't have the pursuit of appiness," he said.

În March 1990, 6,300 union members nationwide went on strike against Greyhound Lines Inc. after negotiators missed a strike deadline.

Dallas-based Greyhound, the country's only national bus line, hired replacement bus drivers.

Union members continue to be bitter about the labor dispute. Their \$50-a-week strike benefits were cut off after only six months and many have given up hope on ever reaching a settlement.
