# Perot leaves race, not campaign, report says

WASHINGTON— Ross Perot continued to spend millions after he dropped from the presidential race in July, maintaining a 50-state organization and quietly preparing campaign advertising.

Those expenditures — \$4 million in August alone — have put Perot in position for an "October surprise" return if he chooses to make that move on Thursday.

But they also underline a stark contrast between what the Texas billionaire has said publicly and what he has done privately since ending his independent bid for the White House.

At the same time he was spending the money, Perot was declaring that he would not play a

spoiler's role, that the chances of his returning were comparable to the likelihood that "a hurricane will go straight up in the air to day" or "lightning going to strike here in two seconds."

"It smacks of double dealing," said Stephen Hess, a political analyst with the Brookings Institution.

But Murphy Martin, a close Perot associate who has helped in recent weeks to prepare ads, disagreed.

Campaign finance reports filed with the government show Perot has spent \$18.5 million — \$16 million of it his own money — since first mentioning the possibility of an independent campaign in March.

More than half of that total has been spent since he withdrew \$6.6 million in July and \$4 million in August.

That fact is not lost on the political professionals who worked on his campaign before it disbanded and who now wonder whether Perot was planning an October surprise all the time.

# Political campaigns: turn off to Texas voters, study says

## Womens' league presents complaints

AUSTIN— Texas voters are turned off by political campaigns, the influence of lobbyists and pressure groups, and the power of incumbents, according to a League of Women Voters study released Wednesday.

"We have discovered that almost all Texans have opinions about the campaign process, and the opinions are highly critical," said Evelyn Bonavita, chair of the League's Texas Education Fund.

The eight-page report entitled, "See How They Run: The Political Campaign Process in Texas," is based on interviews and poll results that show many voters are frustrated and angry about the current political system.

The report also describes "model laws" touted by reformists as a way to get politicians back in touch with the electorate.

The study showed that most Texans believe that campaigns are too long, expensive, negative and confusing.

Most also believe that cam-

aign expenditures should be limited, but disagree that campaigns should be financed with public funds.

One former state office candidate said negative campaigning lessens respect for the office, and leaves the winner no clear mandate because issues were not debated during the campaign, according to the report.

The study found that many believe that campaigns are being dominated by political advertising rather than debates between candidates.

The high cost of these packaged campaigns make the candidate more dependent on special-interest contributions and less available to the public for an examination of his or her political beliefs, the report said.

Campaign expense reports are available for public scrutiny at the Texas Ethics Commission, but the League says "there is not currently a user-friendly data base that enables researchers to pinpoint readily specific information on how contributions are raised and spent."
