Clinton endorses free-trade treaty

RALEIGH, N.C. — Democrat Bill Clinton on Sunday endorsed the controversial free-trade treaty with Mexico, but said he would not sign it unless additional steps were taken to protect American workers.

"If it is done right, it will create jobs in the United States and in Mexico," the Arkansas governor said in an address at North Carolina State University.

"We must always remember why we're doing it — to help the working men and women of America."

The announcement ended weeks of speculation over how the Democratic nominee would land on the trade pact, which was completed in August after 14 months of negotiation by the Bush administration.

Clinton sought to tread a middle ground on the issue, endorsing the pact while stressing the need to look out for U.S. workers.

The pact has been opposed by many leading Democrats, major labor groups, and environmental organizations.

Gradually, over a 15-year period, all tariffs for goods and services and all barriers to investment over the borders of the United States, Mexico and Canada would be eliminated. Canada and the United States earlier had reached agreement on a trade pact.

The result would be the largest single trade bloc in the world surpassing the European community both in consumer demand, with 360 million customers, and in economic output with \$6 trillion in output.

President Bush and Mexican and Canadian officials were scheduled to observe the initialing of the agreement by trade ministers on Wednesday. The Bush administration predicted the treaty could create 400,000 jobs by 1995, by stimulating the economies of all three nations.

House Majority Leader Richard Gephardt, D-Mo., contends it should be renegotiated and Sen. Howard Metzenbaum, said the agreement could cost 550,000 U.S. jobs over the next decade. Missouri, Ohio and other Midwest industrial states are critical in the election.

Rallies to boost Perot in poll, supporters say

HARRISBURG, Pa. — A blitz of pep rallies, news conferences and word-of-mouth will help propel Ross Perot to the White House, his Pennsylvania supporters say.

Chief organizers from throughout the state dismiss Perot's 7 percent standing in the polls and political pundits who say the Texas billionaire has virtually no chance of winning the election.

"There are a lot of people out there who want Perot, they just haven't come forward yet," said Rebecca Lyttle, a coordinator for seven mid-state counties, including Lancaster, York and Lebanon.

"There are a lot of people that because of peer pressure

are criticizing Perot, but when it comes down to it, they are not going to vote for Bush or Clinton," she said.

Perot announced last week that he is re-entering the presidential race because his supporters felt President Bush and Arkansas Gov. Bill Clinton haven't adequately addressed the country's fiscal concerns. Perot had withdrawn in July.

About 80 chief volunteers from throughout the state met in Harrisburg Saturday to devise a strategy for the last four weeks of the election.

Leaders say they will campaign heavily for Perot on a local level, using rallies and enthusiastic volunteers to drum up support for their candidate and push for a large voter turnout.

the attention of school officials last Tuesday, a day after the attack, when a school custodian told a teacher what happened and the teacher told school officials.

An assistant principal then called the girl's mother and told her that her daughter had been assaulted by some students, Daniels said.

"I knew something was wrong with her, but I couldn't get her to tell me anything on Monday," the mother said. "I saw that her clothes were just filthy. I didn't find out until Tuesday that the boys had told her not to tell anyone or they would hurt or kill her, so she was too scared to say

anything."

School officials have not determined whether a teacher walked in during the incident and failed to report it, although they are investigating the possibility, Jessie said.

According to Daniels, a school official eventually did report the incident to police at the mother's urging. That report was made last Tuesday, he said.

However, Houston police spokesman Rick Hartley said Saturday he did not know whether a report had been filed on what action, if any, police had taken in the case.

The girl's mother has asked that her daughter be transferred to another school.

"I think everything is OK if my children are in school — that school is safe," the mother said.
