The Student Senate approved legislation
Wednesday concerrining student liaisonns and Wednesday concerning sprovent legtiasislatation and
handicap facilities on the Texas A\&M Univerhandicap faci
sity campus.
Senate Bill 92-12, dealing with student li-
aisons between the Student Senate Faculty aisons between the Student Senate, Faculty
Senate and Bryan-College Station City Councils, was approved with the addition of an
amendment after a short debate on the floor.
The legislation adds an amendment to Senate by-l-lws to make student liaisons members
of the Senate. Appointment of these ligions will be based on submission of applications and will be open to any qualified students.
Brian Walker, speaker of the Senate, intro-
duced the second piece of legislation passed,
