Perot promises one term, no pay

RICHMOND, Va. - Ross Perot tried to cement his credentials as an outsider in Thursday night's debate by promising to serve just one term if elected president and renewing his pledge to serve without pay.

The Texas businessman, in a reprise of his feisty performance in the first debate, seemed unaffected by his running mate's rattled debate performance earlier in the week.

"I intend to be there one term. I do not intend to spend one minute of one day thinking about re-election," said billionaire Perot. He added, acknowledging that his own situation is unique, "I would take absolutely no compensa-

Perot was as chipper and homespun as ever. He also was as vague as ever on his eat-yourspinach economic plans, telling viewers repeatedly that they should watch his new 30-minute advertisement Friday night if they wanted the details.

"It's a long subject," he said with a crinkly smile.

Perotstyle came across in classic form when he was asked how, specifically, he would reduce health care costs.

'You own this country but you have no voice in it the way it's organized now," he began. But that was only the beginning.

"If you want to have a high-risk experience comparable to bungeejumping," Perot said, visit Congress when it's considering health-care legislation and watch the lobbyists in action.
