After going 1-2 in the first three matches of the week, the Texas A&M Lady Aggie volleyball team needed a win Saturday over the University of Texas-San Antonio to break even for the week.

Led by senior Elizabeth Edmiston and junior Kim Mitchell, the Lady Aggies were able to move their record to 15-13 on the season as they rallied from an 8-1 deficit in game five to defeat the Lady Roadrunners 15-9, 15-2, 11-15, 3-15, 15-13.

Edmiston and Mitchell paced A&M with 15 kills each to help the Lady Aggies take the non-confer-ence match at the UTSA Convocation Center.

The Lady Aggies took the first two games easily, recording a .282 hitting percentage in game one and a .274 hitting percentage in game two.

But, despite hitting .357 in the third game, UTSA was able able to take advantage of six errors from A&M to pull out a 15-11 win.

The Lady Roadrunners were paced by Leslie Dodson, who recorded a school-record 33 kills in the match.


