Leaders call for audits

AUSTIN - Texas' top three leaders called for audits of all school districts Monday, after an examination of 55 districts found that some were spending money on items including entertainment.

"We have got to show the taxpayers that we are spending our school dollars wisely, that Jay Leno tickets don't make the cut," Gov. Ann Richards said in the second week of a special session on school finance reform.

House Speaker Gib Lewis said it may take several years to examine every school district, but he has asked the state auditor to develop a plan.

Lt. Gov. Bob Bullock said it's unfair to draw conclusions from auditing only a handful of Texas' 1000-plus school districts.

Trade embargo defiants to enter Mexico

SAN ANTONIO - U.S. Customs officials said Monday they will allow members of a group defying a Cuba trade embargo to enter

Mexico as long as they apply for permits to cross the international bridge from Laredo.

But Elizabeth Flannery, a spokeswoman for Pastors for Peace, the Minnesota-based group

organizing the protest, said applying for such licenses would be "allowing the (U.S.) governder. willing to be jailed if unable to cross the der. ment to decide for us how and when we can bring the aid."

Leonard Lindheim, head of the federal agency's San Antonio office, said the caravan would not be allowed onto the U.S.-Mexico international bridge without the permits.
