



# 'Bram Stoker's Dracula'

It's not just another blood-sucking monster movie

"Bram Stoker's Dracula" Starring Anthony Hopkins, Gary Oldman, Keanu Reeves, Winona Ryder Directed by Francis Ford Playing at Cinema 3

"Bram Stoker's Dracula" struck me as an antonym for the 'milk does the body good' commercials. Something about all the bloodsucking that goes on in the movie kept making me think that this was some sort of hype for the nutritional power of blood.

However, a glass of milk never lets me turn into an invisible creature of the night or become a neon green mist that floats through the darkness.

But that is the point of Dracula; a commitment to the deep dark underworld may provide a few extra powers but it also comes with a lot of evil responsibilities, the hassle of finding necks to suck on and some nasty bloodstains.

"Dracula" is a visual playground. The creative cinematography is the hip of hop, the king of cool, and secured my approval, but the movie did lean rather heavily on visual

After four centuries of existence, Dracula (Gary Oldman) is ready to quench his deep-down body thirst. So he heads out for London, where he meets Mina (Winona Ryder), the young and beautiful fiancée of Harker (Keanu Reeves).

Mina's resemblance to Dracula's deceased wife again brings out his human side. However, when Dracula begins a rather explicit relationship with Mina's friend Lucy (Sadie Frost), something must be done.

The eccentric doctor, Van Helsing (Anthony Hopkins), leads a rescue squad that is, for better or worse, out to catch itself a monster.

"Dracula" pulls that everloved good vs. evil theme out of the literary woodwork. But, it also sounds pretty much like modern romance to me. Lovers being caught somewhere between loving each other for the rest of eternity or sucking out all of each other's blood. Hey, sounds about right.

The characters in "Dracula" are strong, as I anticipated from the well-known names in the

I was most impressed by Winona Ryder's performance. She was sincere in her intensity, authentic in her desperation, and her accent sounded cool.

On the same note, this is the first movie that Keanu Reeves has managed to keep that waycool surfer sound from creeping out of his mouth, even though he sounded sort of congested.

Watching "Dracula" was sort of like looking at modern art. The action flips back and forth across different parts of the world rather frequently, and it is easy to fall one step behind in comprehension.

Fortunately, Francis Ford Coppola provides such creative transitions between scenes that I almost did not mind the moments of confusion.

The movie is a rather erotic interpretation. Some of the more bizarre sexual scenes caught my attention but made me wonder if they were necessary or merely included for their shock value

If the movie is taken beyond the level of mere blood-sucking monster horror story, it provides insight into the nature of evil and man. That is more than can be said about "Friday the 13th" or "A Nightmare on Elm

If you plan to see "Dracula", I would suggest A) waiting for the novelty to die down or B) purchasing tickets in advance. I spent 30 minutes just waiting to get into the theater.
