we will play anybody," Glenn said.

A&M running back Greg Hill happily reveled in the win against the Longhorns but said that he would be disappointed if he didn't get to play for the national title.

"This is a sub-national championship," Hill said. "We deserve to

play for the national championship - point blank. We have nothing left to prove.

"If we aren't playing for a national championship on New Year's Day, then something is wrong."

Texas center Turk McDonald also credited the Aggies with being an elite team.

"I give them a lot of credit; they're a good football team," he said. "They are the best defense we've played all year. They are strong, physical, and fast."

Inside linebacker Jason Atkin-

son agreed with the tenor of his teammates on who the Aggies should play in the Cotton Bowl.

"We deserve nothing less than the best team out there," Atkinson said. "We're 12-0 with 21 straight regular season wins. You just can't beat that."

Senior guard John Ellisor, playing in his last regular season game as an Aggie, reflected on his team's accomplishments.

"You think you will stumble somewhere, but now that we're here, it's a feeling I can't describe," Ellisor said.
