Richards pays for guest spot

AUSTIN (AP) — Gov. Ann Richards' commerce department paid \$150,000 to entertainer Bob Hope, who will include Richards as a guest on his nationally televised Christmas special being filmed in San Antonio, officials said Tuesday.

The Texas Republican Party questioned the use of state funds, and Richards' appearance on the program.

Karen Hughes, executive director of the state GOP, said state money should not have been used when other needs go unmet. She said Richards will "showcase herself."

Richards' office defended her appearance, saying it was non-political and gave the governor a chance to tout Texas. In addition, her office said Hope's producers asked her to be on the show.

"She is the state's premiere pitch person. That's what she is supposed to do," said Richards' press

secretary Bill Cryer.

Commerce Department officials defended the expense, saying the program will generate tourist dollars by showing off Texas to an audience of some 14 million viewers.

"It's an excellent value for the state," Commerce Department executive director Cathy Bonner said. "It's going to be incredible coverage for the state and San Antonio."

The San Antonio Convention and Visitors Bureau, and theme parks Sea World of Texas and Fiesta Texas, also paid \$150,000 each for a total of \$600,000 to Hope's production company, state officials said.

Hughes of the state GOP said that this expense should have been paid for entirely by the private sector because the state is strapped for funds as lawmakers fight over a school financing system.

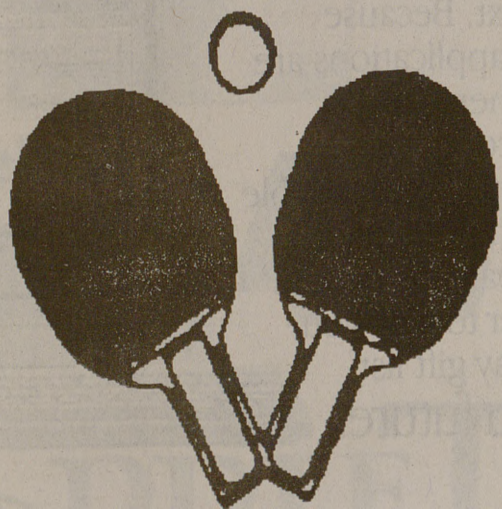

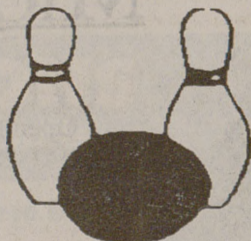
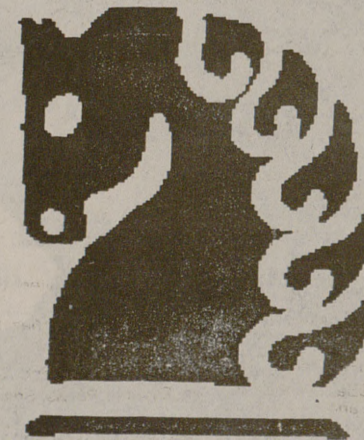
