must face Missouri, South Alabama, Florida, Alabama and Nevada-Las Vegas.
 Barone said he feels that the schedule can only help the Aggie basketball program to get their shot against some of the best teams in the country.
 "You make decisions based on where you want to be, not where you are right now," Barone said. "I'm not concerned with what our record looks like early. I'm concerned with competing."
 When asked why he didn't open his schedule with an easy team like the Sisters of the Poor, Barone quipped, "We went right to the Vatican instead."
 Most of Barone's disciples will be back this season, except for outgoing seniors Anthony Ware

and Shedrick Anderson. Johnson a sophomore forward out of Converse Judson, will be back and he said that his team will have to be playing its best for the long haul that awaits.
 "It will be no cakewalk," Johnson said. "We've got to be really focused and ready to play every night. But we've all grown up a little bit, and I think we improved during the offseason."
 The undefeated A&M football team has drawn most of the attention on campus this season, and Barone understands why that is so. However, he said he hopes that the same enthusiasm about the football team can be transferred to basketball.
 "Our football team has been phenomenal," he said. "You have one of the top three teams in the country right here in College Station, Texas."
 "I just hope that R.C. (Slocum A&M head football coach) hasn't spoiled anyone."

what might have been.
 A&M came closer to the former, as Johnson's teammates played well enough to scare a few opponents in their first rebuilding year under head coach Tony Barone. And as guard David Edwards said, they did not have much choice but to turn things up a notch.
 "We just had to find somebody to step up," Edwards said. "When he was gone, we lost 19 points a game. We called certain plays, and nobody was certain about what to do. He (Johnson) was guaranteed to go to the line if he got the ball."
 Before his injury, Johnson went to the line frequently and with authority. He assaulted Texas Christian for 25 points and 16 rebounds in A&M's conference opener, and finished with 14 points and 15 boards against Southern Methodist in the Aggies next contest.
 That kind of output makes Johnson wonder if, barring his injury, last year would have been as close to perfect as it gets.
 "It (the season) definitely would have been one of the best," Johnson said.
 Johnson has an added advantage this year, after he took part in a SWC Australian tour over the summer. On that trip, he was able to hone his inside game against

larger, more physically-intimidating opponents, while picking up a few inside tips about his fellow conference members at the same time.
 "Over there, we were playing older people, and they were really physical," Johnson said. "(As a result) I became a lot more physical."
 "Plus, I got kind of a scouting report on other people I was playing with. But I guess the same goes for them, too."
 With two forwards, three guards and no post men, the Aggies will be looking to find the best possible way to make up for their lack of height. Johnson knows his role in A&M's fast-paced offense, and it is a simple one - just be in position to finish off the break.
 "It's not really a run-and-shoot type of offense, but we do run that lot," Johnson said. "We don't have a lot of height, but we've got a lot of speed."
 "You've got to be in better shape. If we've got an open break, we've got to take it. It's a fast-paced game, and that's the kind of game we like."
 If the Aggies are able to work the fast break to perfection, Johnson's goal of a .500 final record might come to fruition. The team is more familiar with Barone's system, he said, and is fully aware of what Barone expects out of his players.
 Johnson's goal for himself is much simpler - no more injuries and no more lost opportunities.
 "I'm just praying that I stay healthy."
