The most impressive thing about Edwards' night against the Jaguars was his coolness from the throw line, if not his ability to cheer and play simultaneously. He hit 14 of 17 attempts from the stripe, most of those coming in the final 10 minutes when South Alabama's press actually did more harm than good through the increase in fouls.

In addition to breaking the South Alabama press, Barone said

that the failure of two key Jaguars to play up to their previous games was important.

Star point man Cedric Yelding led the game in assists with 12, but hit only two of seven from the field for five points. And top reserve Charlie Burke was a non-factor, also finishing with five points and just one rebound.

"We needed to keep Yelding and Burke out of the game, and we did that," Barone said.

As the Aggies ponder their most important win in the past two seasons, Barone said that the confidence the game produced

will probably be the overriding theme. But the main theme for Barone himself is an almost giddy sense of joy, a feeling that is much-deserved.

"I don't think that we backed into that win," Barone said. "I thought that we took it. I thought tonight we learned how to win."

"I don't know why I'm so excited. I really don't."

Barone and the Aggies will have an entire week to come back to earth. Their next contest will be Dec. 17, when they face Northwestern University in Evanston, Ill.
