"We have to come out focused and execute our offense, and play tough defense," he said. "We have to do that because TCU is in a slump just like we are, so we need to be prepared for their best effort."

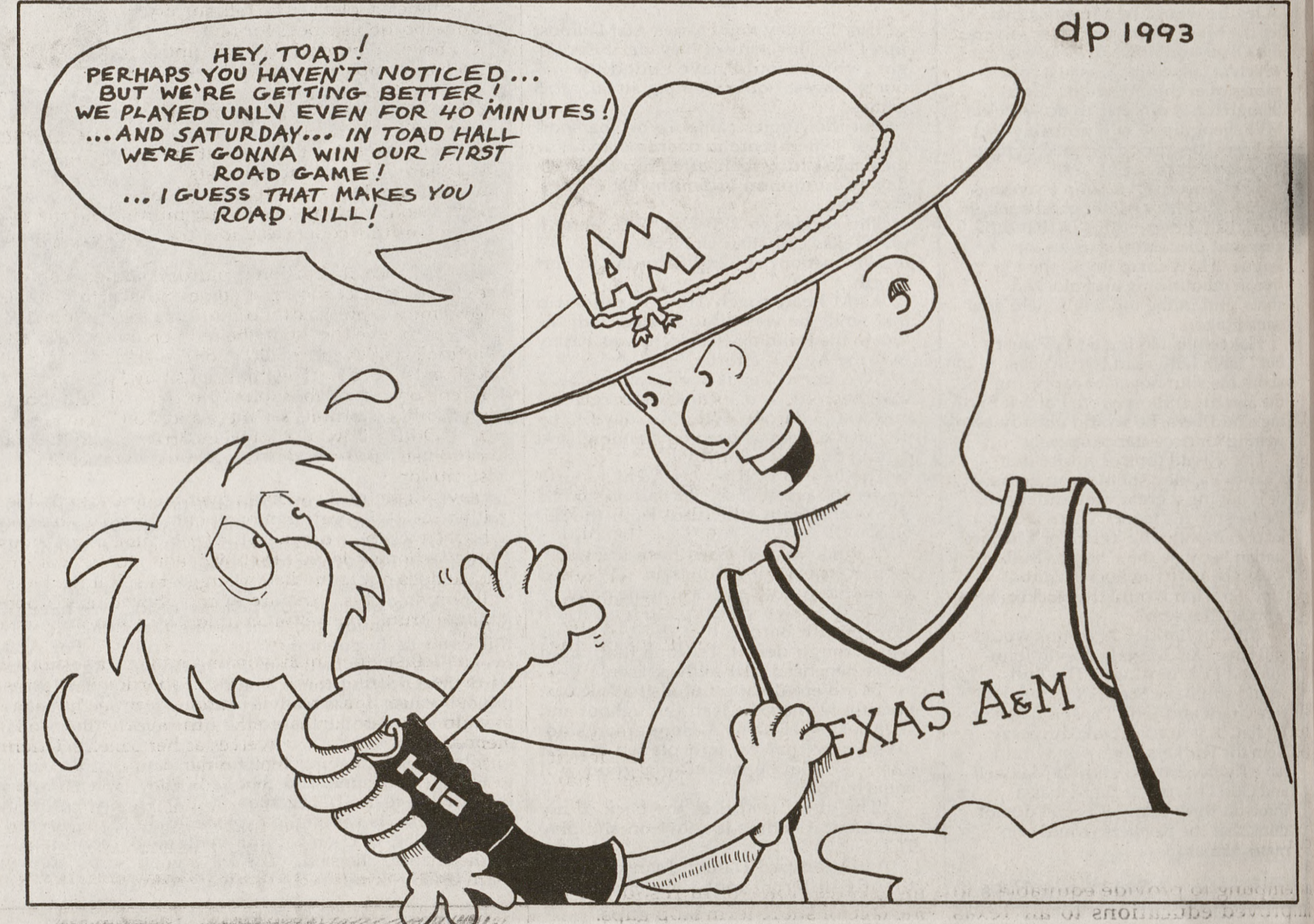
Patriots lure Parcels from broadcast booth

BOSTON — The word "championship" flowed repeatedly from Bill Parcels' lips as he returned to coaching Thursday, even if he must rebuild the New England Patriots team.
Parcels, winner of two Super Bowls in his last five years as head coach of the New York Giants, takes charge of a team that tied for the NFL's worst record and has won just four playoff games in its 33-year history.
"History," he declared, "means nothing in football."
With Massachusetts Gov.

William Weld looking on, Parcels was introduced in a chandeliered conference room of a fancy downtown hotel.
Patriots owner Jim Orthwein called the signing of Parcels "the beginning of a new and exciting chapter in the history of the New England Patriots."
At a meeting late last week, he said, Orthwein asked him what it would take to make the Patriots competitive.
"I told him I wasn't interested in a competitive team, but rather if he was interested in bringing a championship team to New England, then I was his man," Par-

cells said at a news conference. "That's the only goal a guy like me can have."
"I emphasize the word championship because that's what I'm trying to do," he added. "When (Orthwein) said, 'That's what I want to do, too,' I got real interested."
Details of Parcels' multiyear contract were not released but he said, "this is my last coaching job, without question."
Patriots officials also interviewed former coaches Buddy Ryan of the Philadelphia Eagles and Mike Ditka of the Chicago Bears.

After a run-in with management, Hakeem was put on the trading block and shopped around during the summer. But no deals could be reached, so he was forced to start the season for a team he did not want to play

on. Would he carry a grudge onto the court? Would he be less motivated? Would he be such a problem that he would force the Rockets to trade him?
All those questions were answered when he became the most consistent player in the league this year. If he played in Los Angeles, he would have already been on the cover of Sports Illustrated twice.

After all that, he is still the Rockets go-to guy, even though he is mostly double and triple-teamed every night. He is the defensive stopper and a player who leads by emotion and example. He has learned to keep himself out of foul trouble because he knows there is no capable backup on the bench. Hakeem Olajuwon is the heart and soul of the Rockets. Without him they

would have a tough time beating the Dallas Mavericks.
The last ten MVP awards have been given to players who have played in the bigger television markets. It should not matter where a player plays to win an individual award, but sadly, that is what the MVP is all about. Because he plays in Houston, Hakeem will probably have to settle for a fourth-place finish
