would be difficult to choose between the six candidates vying for Sen. Loyd Bentsen's seat in the senate, but ultimately, he was the best choice because of his economic experience.

Economic issues will drive the race for senator, Barton said, and his record was the best of all the candidates on economic issues.

Barton said for there to be American prosperity, there has to be a balanced budget in Washing-

ton D.C., and his balanced budget amendment was the best answer.

"The state of Texas has to do it, Brazos county has to do it, and you have to do it in your daily lives," Barton said.

The Barton balanced budget amendment, among other things, requires the president to submit a balanced budget, Congress to vote on a balanced budget and a 60 percent majority in Congress to spend more than the government receives.

Making a job at ex-Rail Road Commissioner Lena Guerrero, Barton said there were many reasons for Brazos Valley to support him, but first and foremost was

the fact that he was an Aggie, "and I can remember when I graduated."

Barton invited everyone to call the Texas A&M registrar's office and check to see that he had all his hours.

Emphasizing his own policy of requiring periodic drug testing for he and his staff, Barton criticized President Clinton for his 30 day delay on drug testing for White House staff.

White House communications chief George Stephanopoulos said, "I think we'll be able to sell it."

"Whenever you try to make progress in civil rights, in ending discrimination, there is opposition at the front," he said. "It's always difficult. I think here there are some special difficulties with the military in making sure that we do maintain good order and discipline."

Senate Armed Services Committee Chairman Sam Nunn promised hearings on the issue in March, and said the administration was failing to listen to the needs of service men and women.

"I think something is fundamentally flawed when the men and women in the military have an issue that is vital to them, that affects them, and they never have

Administration officials said Clinton has prepared a two-step process to revoke them.

In the first step, the president would simply direct Defense Secretary Les Aspin that the practice of asking the sexual orientation of recruits and stop proceedings to oust declared homosexuals.

The second phase calls for developing an executive order, formally lifting the ban and addressing the problems raised by the Joint Chiefs and others.

Stephanopoulos said Clinton would move forward on his policy this week.

A memo from Aspin to Clinton said the president should give the defense secretaries six months to draft an executive order lifting the ban.

economic policy in much the same way that the older National Security Council oversees foreign and defense policies.

"I believe that this will enable us to make economic policy in a much more specific, clear, and effective way than the federal government has in quite a long while," Clinton said.

The panel is made up secretaries of most key Cab-

inet posts and other top policy advisers.

The White House did not retreat from Bentsen's comments on NBC-TV's "Meet the Press" a day earlier.

"I thought he did a very good job on television," Clinton said. "We have a lot of options under consideration, but no decision has been made," Clinton said.

Bentsen, interviewed on NBC-TV's "Meet the Press," said flatly: "What you're going to see...is some consumption tax is going to take place."

He said a tax on energy consumption would raise revenues and encourage conservation, while helping to lessen the nation's reliance on imported oil.
