Lonnie Stabler said it makes sense for College Station to provide funding because the city will collect property taxes on the land, but Bryan will not.

"When College Station gives that money, they collect personal property taxes by the people who have businesses on the property," he said. "But Bryan will not get a return on its dollar in this sense."

Bryan City Councilman Rudy Schultz said if funding is avail-able, it should be split between Easterwood Airport and Bryan's own airport, Coulter Field.

"First of all, we have tight budget constraints in Bryan, and I'm not sure we have \$100,000 for air-port funding," he said. "If the council thinks we have the money, we should give half of the

money to Easterwood and half to Coulter Field. Bryan has their own airport to consider.

Stabler said Bryan should im-

prove Coulter Field before spending money on Easterwood's private air facilities. "It's a slap in Coulter's face if we improve the conditions for pri-vate aircraft at Easterwood," he

If improved, the money could come from a contingency fund containing \$118,000, he said. A contingency fund contains money set aside for items not foreseen at the time of the budget process. If money must be given to East-

erwood Airport, the money

should be used to improve the McKenzie Terminal and the commercial airline facilities, not the private-use facilities, Stabler said. "I think we should go ahead and give \$100,000 for commercial aviation," he said. "I'm more con-

cerned the money go in an area

Bryan Mayor Marvin Tate said

it is not uncommon for Bryan to provide financial support to its neighboring city. Giving the money to the old Easterwood Termina in College Station symbolizes continued cooperation between the two cities, he said.

"One-hundred thousand dollars won't make or break Texas
