consolidating it with the division of student services to strengthen minority recruitment.

- Adopting six hours of integration leadership studies.
- Revising tenure policy to account for teaching and service.
- Expanding the minority scholarship program.
- Implementing a uniform reporting procedure for discriminatory actions.
- Establishing an annual summer institute for faculty support of curriculum development.

Jeffrey Brown, a senior English and history major and member of DEC '92, said it seems recommendations are made to be broken.

"Recommendations have been made, but what has been done to implement them?" Brown asked.

"Nobody knows; nobody cares." Brown said his organization would be there to ask why recommendations are not followed.

Carreathers said the University cannot help ignoring some of the committee's recommendations because the money that may have been available for them when the report was completed is no longer available.

Even the funds were available, the University does not have the freedom to fund whatever it wants, he said.

A&M has to deal with state and federal guidelines, Carreathers said, as well as the conditions some donors place on their financial gifts.

"One has to realize where funding comes from," he said. "Everyone seems to think A&M has a blank check to spend as they please."

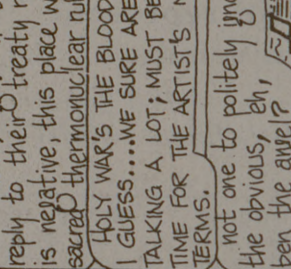

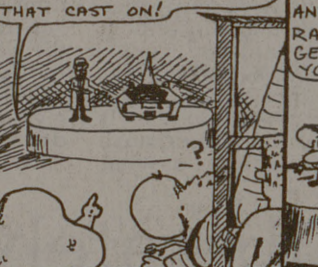

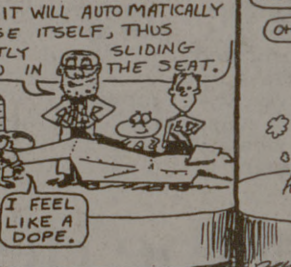

**Bryan Council considers funding Easterwood renovations**

Lonnie Stabler said it makes sense for College Station to provide funding because the city will collect property taxes on the land, but Bryan will not.

"When College Station gives that money, they collect personal property taxes by the people who have businesses on the property," he said. "But Bryan will not get a

return on its dollar in this sense."

Bryan City Councilman Rudy Schultz said if funding is available, it should be split between Easterwood Airport and Bryan's own airport, Coulter Field.

"First of all, we have tight budget constraints in Bryan, and I'm not sure we have \$100,000 for airport funding," he said. "If the council thinks we have the money, we should give half of the

money to Easterwood and half to Coulter Field. Bryan has their own airport to consider."

Stabler said Bryan should improve Coulter Field before spending money on Easterwood's private air facilities.

"It's a slap in Coulter's face if we improve the conditions for private aircraft at Easterwood," he said.

If improved, the money could come from a contingency fund containing \$118,000, he said. A contingency fund contains money set aside for items not foreseen at the time of the budget process.

If money must be given to Easterwood Airport, the money should be used to improve the McKenzie Terminal and the commercial airline facilities, not the private-use facilities, Stabler said.

"I think we should go ahead and give \$100,000 for commercial aviation," he said. "I'm more concerned the money go in an area that will benefit the entire Brazos Valley, instead of just one seg-

ment."

Bryan Mayor Marvin Tate said it is not uncommon for Bryan to provide financial support to its neighboring city. Giving the money to the old Easterwood Terminal in College Station symbolizes continued cooperation between the two cities, he said.

"One hundred thousand dollars won't make or break Texas A&M," he said. "But it's the message we're sending. It's important from the standpoint of cooperation."

Tate said improved private plane facilities at Easterwood will appeal to people looking to start a business in the Brazos Valley.

"If we're going to attract business executives, we need a nice place for them to fly into," he said.

Floyd said the Bryan City Council will probably resolve this item quickly.

"Historically, I believe Bryan, College Station and the Brazos County have supported this airport," he said.
