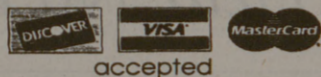

# Organization offers forum for discussion of multiculturalism

Texas A&M students will discuss cultural intolerance and insensitivity while experiencing first-hand the situations other students face in a day-long open forum institute sponsored by S.T.E.P. O.N.E. this Saturday.

S.T.E.P. O.N.E. (Starting To Eliminate Prejudice by Offering New Experiences) is a student organization which offers cross-cultural experiences like Saturday's seminar, to be held in Rudder Tower, to better enable students to adapt and relate to each other.

Sheri Schmidt, a student development specialist with the Department of Multicultural Services, will act as moderator for the day's activities and discussions as participants role-play and interact with one another.

Director Wilmer Roberts said, "I'm going to experience what you're going through; you're going to experience what you're going through; and we're going to experience each other and learn from each other."

Learning to deal with people in a professional environment is one topic the institute will address, Roberts said.

"A&M likes to brag 'One day you'll work for me,' but you can't be somebody's boss and not know how to deal with people who are working for you," he said. "Worse still, if you had to work for somebody who was of a culture you weren't used to dealing with, problems could arise."

The idea of a program addressing issues while offering new experiences first drew Roberts' interest to S.T.E.P. O.N.E.

"Instead of just talking about something or having a person spit a bunch of information out at you,

the institute offers an interactive setting," he said.

Roberts said he hopes participants will gain a realization of themselves as well as different cultures in Saturday's seminar.

"You can't really understand someone else until you understand yourself," he said. "You'll first learn how to understand yourself, and then by understanding yourself fully, you can understand and appreciate others."

An important part of understanding people is not only understanding differences but also understanding similarities, Roberts said.

"In my daily existence, I've found that just as different as I was from other individuals in my own culture or in another culture, there was something common to both of us," he said.

Roberts stressed that S.T.E.P. O.N.E.'s institute is not designed to be a threatening situation.

"It's an open forum, and we're looking for responses from students," he said. "With that kind of format, it's only as threatening as you allow it to be."

But S.T.E.P. O.N.E. is unlike most other organizations at A&M in that it targets the ordinary student, Roberts said.

"A lot of programs at this university are targeted at the leaders or at people who have shown that they want to lead something," he said. "Those people are not the ones who might need a seminar like S.T.E.P. O.N.E."

"A lot of times, the leaders are already at some level of cultural awareness. If they are not, then they're close to becoming aware. It's not really possible to be any kind of leader at most universities and not be culturally aware or sensitive."

Activities will begin at 10 a.m. in 707 Rudder and conclude at 4 p.m. Students may register for the institute with the Department of Multicultural Services. The \$10 registration fee includes the cost of lunch and all materials provided during the seminar.

"We are trying to target the area of A&M and the students who have a problem dealing with different cultures and who are willing to correct that problem," Roberts said. "We can't force anybody to come to this. Everyone must recognize it for themselves and come on their own."

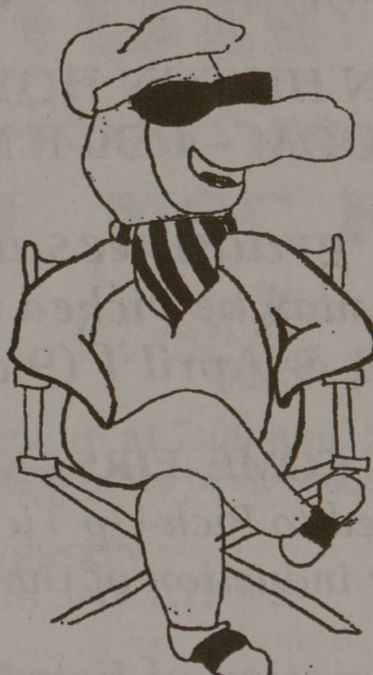
