Texas A&M's next student body president needs to be willing to make hard decisions which will affect student's lives and work to-

wards bringing the campus together, said University officials Monday.

"A student body president needs to articulate and communicate the goals, aspirations and needs of the University inside and outside of the community," said University President Dr. William Mobley.

Mobley said the student body president is the primary communicator of the student body's perspective, and the president needs to take advantage of the many opportunities to interact with the administration.

The president will need to be a good listener and understand how challenging it will be to
