

Sweep of Tech helps give A&M breathing room

Special to the Battalion The Texas Tech Red Raiders came to College Station on Good Friday with the intent of contending for a conference baseball championship.

On Saturday they staggered out of Olsen Field holding slim hopes for mak-ing the conference tournament after being out hit, out pitched and out played during a three game sweep at the hands of Texas A&M.

Aggie coach mark Johnson said he felt fortunate to come away with three wins over the Red Raiders.

"To get a sweep against Tech, well, I wouldn't have bet very much of the house on that," Johnson said.

A&M, ranked second nationally in all three major polls, seized sole possession of first place in the conference with the sweep and stands to ascend to first place in the nation after the top-ranked University of Texas squad dropped two of three games to the Baylor Bears over the weekend.




