

A&M takes first place in all three national polls after weekend sweep

Three separate college baseball polls ranked Texas A&M number one in the country Monday, ousting their conference rival University of Texas for the top

The Collegiate Baseball, Baseball America and USA Today/Coaches Poll placed the Aggies number one after a three-game sweep over Texas Tech and Baylor's sweep of Texas in a double-

header Saturday.

Texas fell to fourth in the USA Today
poll, fifth in Baseball America and sixth in Collegiate Baseball.

A&M coach Mark Johnson said he told


with a nasty arsenal of pitches.
