## **So Crime Stoppers**

The man was carrying a money bag to his car when a black male approached him from behind, hit him in the side of the head and attempted to

take the money bag. The victim fell to the ground and the suspect grabbed onto the bag and demanded that the victim give it to him.

The suspect was unable to get the money bag and fled east on foot.

The suspect is a black male, with a large build and dark skin tone. He was wearing blue jeans,

green Fila high top tennis shoes, a black leather weaved-type belt and an unknown-colored shirt. He also was said to have had a pager hanging out of his pocket.




