

Texas A&M 's expectations are running high for a third straight Cotton Bowl appearance and a shot at a national championship. Only two offensive starters are missing from A&M's best regular season ever at 12-0.

successful this year quarterback Corey Pullig can not afford a "sophomore slump."

"Corey didn't have it all last year, but he caught on fast," Offensive coordinator Bob Toledo said. "The thing that's made a difference now is that after a year he's been able to sit down and analyze what happen to him last year.

"We ran a lot of bad plays last year because we ran into some stacked defenses," he said. "We're trying to get him to the point where they do something defensively we want to take advantage of what they're doing instead of just running the play to run it which puts the burden on him. We're going to put more of burden on him to get us out of some

bad plays this year and he's been doing a good job of that right now." Pullig also did a good job

of jump-starting the Aggie offense when he started the final five regular season games of the season.

"I think this year is going to be easier on me because I don't have to prove myself ed to have a every week," Pullig said. "Last year, we didn't just try to go out and win a couple of games and get a little respect," Pullig said. "We were going out each week and fighting to win that game no matter what it took. I think this year's team will have that

> same attitude." According to Toledo, Pullig's consistency is what helps him to be a good quarterback.

"Corey has great poise, he doesn't have those highs and lows," Toledo said. "When he's doing well he doesn't think much about it, when he makes mistakes he doesn't think much about it. "He forgets about them quick there's not a lot of those peaks and valleys. He's consistent and to
