

Over 300 Corps members help honor leukemia victim

The Texas A&M University Corps of Cadets held a blood drive Friday in honor of a senior cadet's mother who has leukemia.

Shannon Caldwell, an animal science major, said he was very impressed by the number of people who came out to support his

"I would guess over 300 people showed up, but a lot of people that came couldn't give blood," Caldwell said. "I was really pleased by the turnout. I'd like to thank everyone for their concern."

Caldwell said he was not able

to donate blood or platelets, the ve was planned during the comclotting agent within blood, because he has been donating all summer for his mother.

Two hundred units of blood and 20 units of platelets were given during the blood drive.

Caldwell said the drive is to pay tribute to his mother, not to raise units of blood for her, because platelets must be used within 24 hours after they are withdrawn
