Study reveals findings in cancer prevention

WASHINGTON — Daily doses of beta carotene, vitamin E and selenium reduced cancer deaths by 13 percent in a study conducted in rural China by U.S. researchers.
The five-year study, involving 29,584 people in an area where cancer rates are among the highest in the world, showed that some vitamins and minerals can be of benefit against cancer, according to the National Cancer Institute researchers.
"The study is the first randomized trial to show a significant reduction in cancer in a population supplemented with vitamins and minerals," Dr. William J. Blot said Tuesday.
Blot added that the results "don't automatically translate to the situation in the United States."
Blot and other NCI experts also said the single study does not present conclusive proof that vitamin and mineral supplements, such as in vitamin pills, are protective against cancer.
"At this point in time, NCI recommends that Americans eat a well-balanced diet, low in fat, high in fiber, with plenty of fruits and vegetables, as a way to maintain good health and to reduce the risk of cancer," said Dr. Peter Greenwald, director of the division of cancer prevention and control at NCI. "We do not have a recommendation now for vitamin and mineral supplements."
The population studied, in four communes in a farming area of Northern China, gets less nutrition than most Americans, and has a much higher rate of cancer, Blot noted. As a result, he said, it is impossible to draw a scientifically accurate conclusion that the vitamins that lowered cancer incidence and overall death rates in China would have a similar effect in the United States.
"We feel they do offer a hopeful sign," said Blot. "It strengthens our growing knowledge of the relationship between nutrition and cancer."
The study was conducted in an area of China called Linxian, about 300 miles south-southwest of Beijing, the capital.

The cavalry began in 1986. PMC members also are responsible for upkeep on The Green, the cavalry's drill field and stables. All work done on The Green is done solely by cavalry members.
"Being in 'the Cav' takes hard work, love for tradition and a whole lot of pride," said Matt Worrell, a spokesperson for Parsons Mounted Cavalry.
"The Spirit of '02," the cannon pulled by PMC, was found in 1974 at a bonfire cut on the Brazos River. The cannon is at every home game and all Kyle Field Yell Practices. A crew of eight members maintains, guards and shoots the cannon.
"The cavalry is a one of a kind experience; there's nothing else like it," said Bane Phillippi, Parsons Mounted Cavalry commanding officer.
PMC is the second cavalry established at A&M. The first cavalry began in 1919 and ended in 1943 after the federal government discontinued all collegiate cavalries in the nation.
The cavalry was invited to perform in the 1985 inauguration of former President Ronald Reagan, the San Antonio Battle of the Flowers parade and participates in annual livestock shows in Fort Worth and Houston.
