

UNDERGRADUATE STUDENT REQUIREMENTS:

You must be a <u>Degree Seeking Student</u> and have a minimum of 95 credit hours. (Completed in the Summer of '93 or before.) Please keep in mind when calculating your hours that if you have repeated a previously passed course(s), you cannot receive additional credit hours.

(Transfer hours completed in the Summer of '93 or before that are needed to meet the 95 credit hour requirement, must be posted to your transcript by the deadline.)

2. 30 of your 95 credit hours must be completed in residence at A&M. In the event you are a re-admitted student and you were gone from A&M for (5) or more consecutive semesters, you must complete your last 30 consecutive hours at A&M to meet the residency requirement.

3. You must have a 2.0 cumulative grade point ratio at A&M. 4. You must be in good standing with the University, including no blocks for

Dr. James R. West has been appointed to the position of head of the Department of Human Anatomy and Medical Neurobiology at the Texas A&M University Health Science Center.

West comes to A&M from the University of Iowa's College of Medicine where he has served as a professor of anatomy since 1988.

He has conducted research in fetal alcohol syndrome and the effects of alcohol and cocaine on fetal brain development. His research in this field has been internationally recog-

nized and widely published. West earned his bachelor's degree in psychology from Wi-chita University in 1971 and was awarded a NIMH Training Grant for work toward his doctorate in psychobiology, which he received from the University of California - Irvine in 1975.
