











Crime Stoppers

On Sept. 5, 1993, between 2 a.m. and 2:30 a.m., a black male was walking in the 1100 block of Holik in College Station when three to four white males jumped and started beating him in the face and chest with their fists, kicking him in the stomach and making racial comments to the victim.

The victim could not give a description of the attackers but said the attackers drove off in a newer model, GMC truck, sky blue in color.

The victim was taken to the hospital where he was treated for bruises and abrasions to the face, and an orbital fracture.

This week the College Station Police Depar ment and Brazos County Crime Stoppers ne your help to identify the persons responsible for this aggravated assault "hate crime."

If your information leads to an arrest and gra jury indictment, Crime Stoppers will pay you up \$1,000 in cash.


