## Crime Stoppers

On Sept. 5, 1993, between 2 a.m. and 2:30 a.m., a black male was walking in the 1100 block of Holik in College Station when three to four white males jumped and started beating him in the face and chest with their fists, kicking him in the stomach and making racial comments to the victim.

The victim could not give a description of the attackers but said the attackers drove off in a newer model, GMC truck, sky blue in color.

The victim was taken to the hospital where he was treated for bruises and abrasions to the face,

and an orbital fracture.

This week the College Station Police Department and Brazos County Crime Stoppers need your help to identify the persons responsible for this aggravated assault "hate crime."

If you have any information call Crime Stoppers at 775-TIPS. When you call, you will be given a special coded number to protect your identity.

If your information leads to an arrest and grand jury indictment, Crime Stoppers will pay you up to \$1,000 in cash.

## Police Beat

The following incidents were reported to University Police Department between Sept. 9-15.

### Harassment

Parking Area 9 - A Passport radar detector, Sony Walkman and two compact discs were stolen from the victim's vehicle.

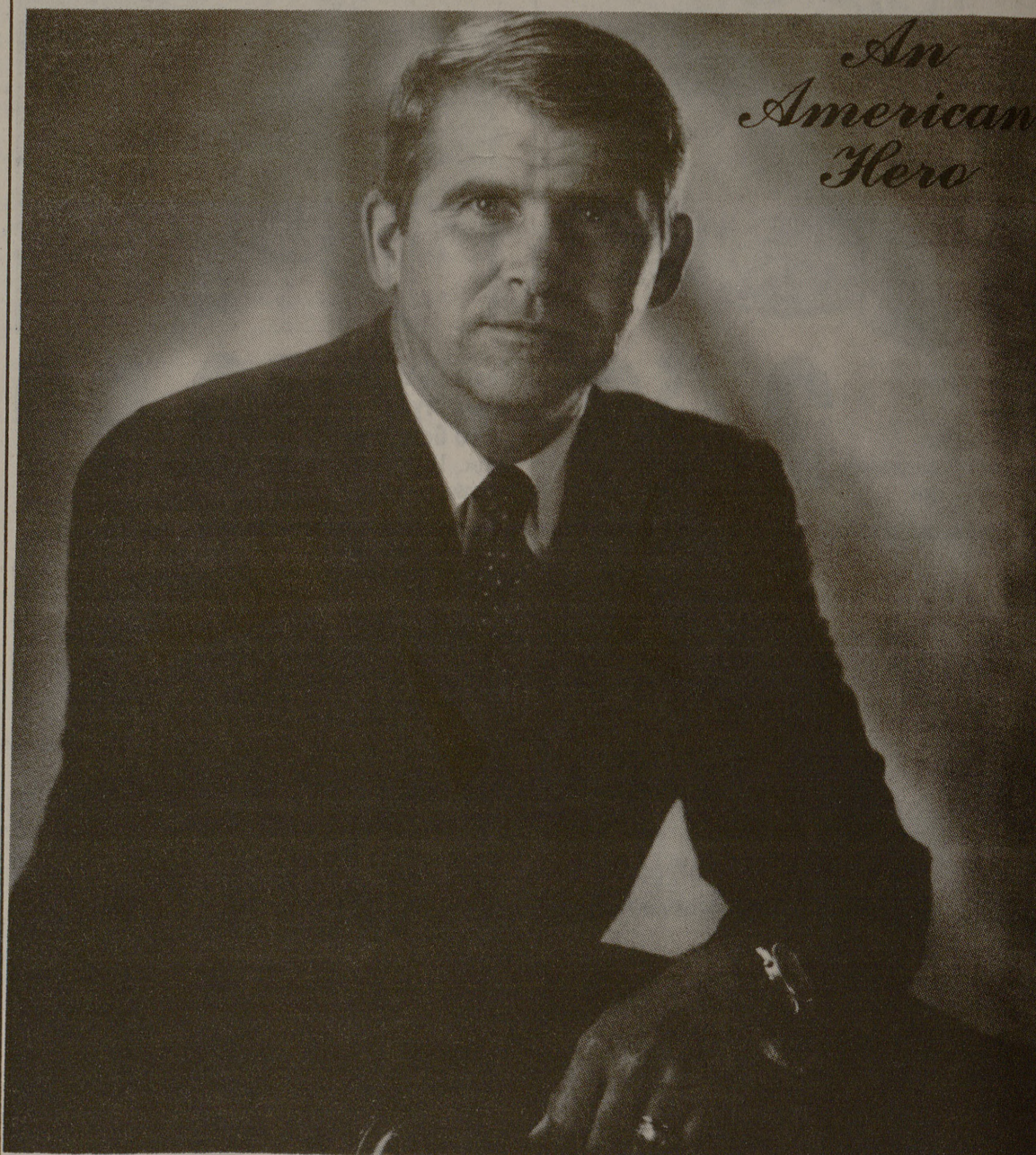
### Terroristic Threat

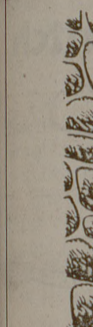
