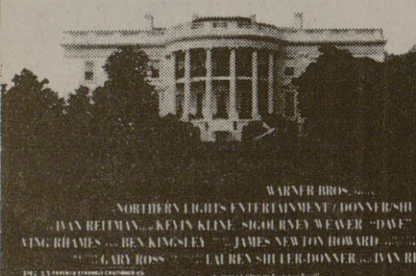

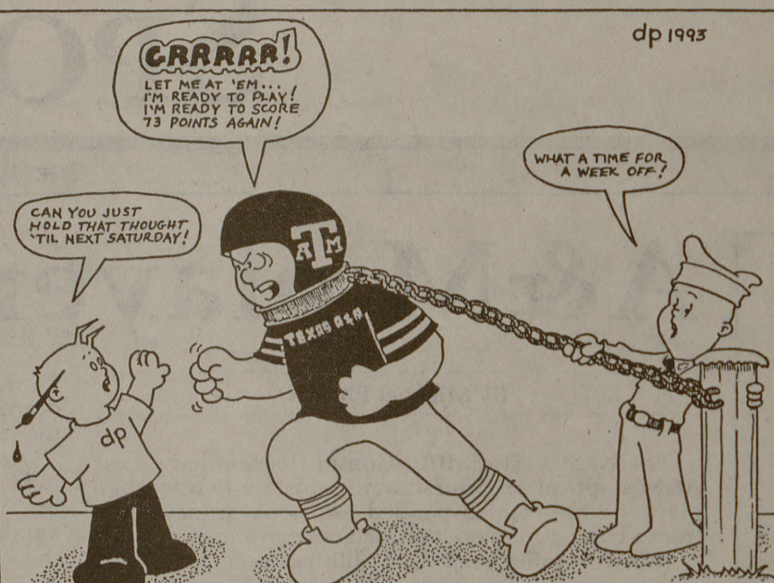

give us the most trouble," Corbelli said. "But we expect to be the favorites this weekend."

A&M beat Texas Tech Wednesday for the first time November 4, 1988, led by senior outside hitter Sheila Morgan, who hit 16 kills and ranks seventh in the nation averaging 5.19 kills per game.

Sophomore setter Suzy Wente currently ranks twentieth in the nation with 12.02 sets per game.

Senior utility player Genny Wood doesn't lead the Lady Aggies in spikes or sets, but rates high with Corbelli.

"Genny Wood is a very good all-around utility player," Corbelli said. "She does everything for us."

Wood totals 1161 digs for her Lady Aggie career, fourth best in A&M history, and needs 15 digs for second place.

"I try to be consistent with whatever I do," she said.

"I realize that this year most of the attention will probably go to Sheila (Morgan) or Suzy (Wente) - but I mostly want the respect of my coaches and teammates."

The Lady Aggies begin play Friday against Alabama at 1 p.m.; their next home game is Saturday, October 2 against Texas-Arlington.

A&M were not enough to overturn the original suspension. "The committee agreed with the eligibility staff's decision," Williams said in a prepared statement.

"There was no information that was submitted that warranted a different result."

A&M interim President E. Dean Gage said he was dismayed by the decision.

"We are disappointed, especially for the young men and their families," Gage said in a prepared statement.

"The University conducted a thorough investigation into this situation and imposed appropriate penalties."

A&M head coach R.C. Slocum said after practice Thursday that he was prepared for the worst.

"I view this from the standpoint that you do what you have to do and we know going that things might not go our way," Slocum said.

Hill and Cox both declined comment on the matter.

A&M can appeal the Committee's decision to a five-member subcommittee of the NCAA Council from fellow Division I institutions.

University officials are undecided if they will pursue another appeal.
