Hall likens Hill to Michae Irvin of the Dallas Cowboys because of their size.

With all the success Hal and Hill have had, they have not been able to lead the Red Raiders to a victory over Texas A&M. Last year, they came close, but A&M kicker a last second field goal for a 19-17 win.

In three games against the Aggies, Hill has 14 catches for 271 yards and one touch-down. Hall has completed 43 of 87 passes and 573 yards and one touchdown in three career starts.

"We can build on last year's game," Hall said. "You don't throw a game like that away
