Tech will try to regroup for their early season woes which have earned them a 1-3 start.

Solari also said Tech's performance against Baylor last week was not a true indication of the type of team they usually field week to week.

"That was not Texas Tech last week," Solari said. "They are a great football team and with a couple of plays here and there they could easily be 4-0."

A&M head coach R.C. Slocum said going to Lubbock will be a challenge for his team, especially with Tech's current situation.

"We're going to Tech, they have their backs against the wall they're at home, they've been on the road and it's a sellout crowd," Slocum said. "Tech is in a desperate, must-win situation."

"They are one of the toughest teams in our league, but we've been in tough situations before and we know what to expect."

Slocum said Tech has one of the top offensive teams in the nation and with the trio of wide receiver Lloyd Hill, quarterback Robert Hall and Morris, it will be a true test for A&M.

"They've got as many weapons on offense as any team in the nation," Slocum said. "They present a lot of problems to teams because they are not a one-dimensional ball club."

In three games against A&M, soon-to-be SWC career yardage leader Lloyd Hill has averaged 100 yards receiving per contest.

Morris has put together a streak of six consecutive 100-yard rushing games, but has been limited to an average of 48 yards and no touchdowns in two games against the Aggies.

Hill has only averaged 184 yards in total offense against the Aggies in three years. This year he is averaging 300 yards in total offense.

Slocum also said this week will be another challenge for the Aggies' offensive unit.

"Their offense puts a lot of pressure on our offense," Slocum said. "We've got to control their running game, we've got to score points because we're playing high-scoring potent offense," Slocum said. "This will be a very good test for us."

"We haven't faced anyone who can put pressure on our pass offense like Tech will."

Rolling A&M spikers take on UTA Saturday

Riding a six-game winning streak, the A&M volleyball team returns home Saturday night to face the University of Texas at Arlington.

The Lady Aggies are ranked sixth in the NCAA South region and are off to their best start since 1986.

"I saw in the preseason that the team had the fighting spirit and wanted to work hard," A&M head coach Laurie Corbelli said.

"I never really looked at the schedule and said we should have a certain record after so many matches."

Corbelli said the team will have to "serve tough" in order to beat the Moovin' Mavs tomorrow night.

"If we do that and continue to play like we have," Corbelli said, "we should come out ahead."

Corbelli said senior outside hitter Sheila Morgan has stepped up this season and played a major role in the Lady Aggies early success.

"I thought in preseason if we could get Sheila and Suzy Wentz to progress and be as effective as I

thought they could be," Corbelli said, "we would be hard to stop."

Morgan, a two-time SWC player of the week this season, leads the SWC with a .343 hitting percentage and a kill average of 5.34 per game.

"She's doing awesome," senior middle blocker Amy Kisling said. "She has shocked everybody and it's great to have her."

Kisling also said she is very excited about how the season is turning out.

"I expected us to do well," Kisling said. "I just didn't expect to do great like we're doing."

Senior middle blocker Kim Mitchell said the team is concentrating on ball control and striving to be more consistent.

"Everybody understands their role," Mitchell said. "If we're all doing our job, we're going to be successful."

Morgan said she feels consistency as well as intensity to be the key that will open the door to further success this season.

"We're still focused knowing that we see that goal at the end of the tunnel," Morgan said.

"It's going to come down to the little things." "We want to make it to the NCAA's."

game we expect to be ourselves," Guerrieri said. "We won't have to hold ourselves back, we'll be able to play at top speed."

"The main thing we'll be trying to concentrate on in that game is taking advantage of opportunities, not giving the other team any easy chances and putting pressure on the other team as much as possible."

Sunday's mishap against Central Florida (3-3 and ninth ranked in the South Region) will be the biggest game for A&M to date.

You can look at the Central Florida game as a real indicator of where we might finish," Guerrieri said. "It'll be a good test for us because we've been together for a month now."

Guerrieri believes playing smart will be the key for the Lady Aggies.

"In the Central Florida (game) we are more or less trying to avoid mistakes," Guerrieri said. "We'll also have to make sure that any chances we get, we finish."
