Undergraduate Student Requirements:

1. You must be a degree seeking student and have a minimum of 95 credit hours. (Completed in the summer of '93 or before.) Please keep in mind when calculating you hours that if you have repeated a previously passed course(s), you cannot receive additional credit hours.
(Transfer hours completed in the summer of '93 or before that are need to meet the 95 credit hour requirement, must be posted to your transcript by the deadline.)
2. 30 of your 95 credit hours must be completed in residence at A&M. In the event you left A&M for (5) or more consecutive Fall and Spring semesters, you must complete 30 consecutive credit hours at A&M after your readmittance to meet the resident hour requirement.
3. You must have a 2.0 cumulative grade point ration at A&M.
4. In good standing with the University, including no blocks for delinquent parking tickets, past due fees, etc.

Graduate Student Requirements:

1. You must receive your graduate degree from Texas A&M University to qualify for a ring. If you are graduating this December and all of you degree requirements have been completed, you may order your ring on this order if you can obtain a "letter of completion" from the office of graduate studies and present it to the ring office by the above deadline.
(Must present the original letter with the seal, not a copy.)
2. In good standing with the University, including no blocks for delinquent parking tickets, past due fees, etc.

Procedure to order a ring:

1. If you have completed all of the above requirements, come to the ring office no later than October 21, 1993 and complete the application for eligibility verification. (Overnight process)
2. If your application is approved and you wish to receive your ring this December, you must pay in full (cash/check only) no later than October 22, 1993.

were aboard within 10 minutes of the explosion, about 45 minutes before another blast rocked the vessel.

After taking the injured to the University of Texas at Galveston's medical complex nearby, the boat returned to help 15 other volunteer vessels fight the fire.

One of the rescued men, 53-year-old Milton Williams of Beaumont, died on the way to the hospital. Another two men, welders whose work might have sparked the explosion, were presumed to have died instantly.

But Coast Guard Capt. Paul Prokop said the efforts of LeBlanc and his crew prevented many more deaths.

"It could have been a great deal worse," Prokop said, adding that the Tim McCall's crew hurried to the rescue, "at some considerable danger to their crew and their vessel, without being asked, without any expectation of anything other than helping our fellow mariners at sea who were in distress."

"They are the true heroes of this," LeBlanc and co-captain Jeff Guidry, of Morgan City, La., shied away from accolades, but they admitted lives were saved through their efforts.

"It's just something where we were in the right place so they didn't have to jump in the water," LeBlanc said. "If they had jumped, with the current and the wind, it would have been a lot worse. Somebody would have drowned or got run over."

Guidry, 50, said he never worried about the danger of the fire or further explosions.

"Anybody would have done the same thing," he said. "I never really thought about it to tell you the truth."

Added LeBlanc, "I don't feel like a hero. I was trying to help those guys get out. I just wish those other boys could have made it, too."

capture remained in effect, and that U.N. forces were still trying to bring him to justice.

Howe, appearing on NBC and ABC's "This Week With David Brinkley," said U.N. forces had had "many opportunities to eliminate Aaidid, but that's not our job."

Aaidid has reportedly called for a cease-fire in the fighting that has left 18 Americans dead over the past week. U.S. officials made clear that while the U.N. resolution calling for his apprehension remained valid, the focus has shifted.

"We have a different set of priorities," Defense Secretary Les Aspin said on ABC. Pressure will be kept on Aaidid until a political settlement is found, but "we are going to depersonalize it and de-emphasize that aspect of it."

Christopher denied that there was any secret peace offer to Aaidid, and said U.S. special envoy to Somalia Robert Oakley, currently in the region trying to coordinate a political solution, has not been instructed to meet the warlord.

But if Aaidid wants to stop fighting unilaterally, "that's fine with us," Christopher said. "And as you know, we had a very quiet night last night in Mogadishu."

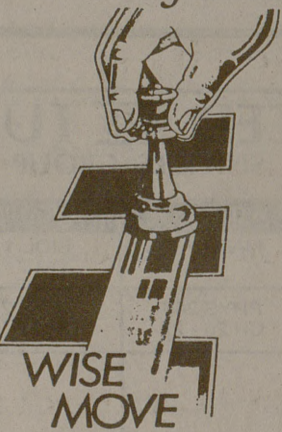
