Undergraduate Student Requirements:

- You must be a **degree seeking student and have a minimum of 95 credit hours.** (Completed in the summer of '93 or before.) Please keep in mind when calculating your hours that if you have repeated a previously passed course(s), you cannot receive additional credit hours. (Transfer hours completed in the summer of '93 or before that are needed to meet the 95 credit hour requirement, must be posted to your transcript by the deadline.)
- 30 of your 95 credit hours must be completed in residence at A&M.** In the event you left A&M for (5) or more consecutive Fall and Spring semesters, you must complete 30 consecutive credit hours at A&M **after your readmittance** to meet the resident hour requirement.
- You must have a 2.0 cumulative grade point ratio at A&M.

to force it from power. The military seized control two years ago by overthrowing President Jean-Bertrand Aristide, Haiti's first freely elected leader.

Aristide is widely popular with Haiti's poor masses, and there is overwhelming support among ordinary Haitians for a U.N. peace plan that would put the traditionally repressive military back in the barracks.

"We know that the majority of the Haitian people support" the U.S. presence, U.S. Embassy spokesman Stanley Schragar said just before the shouting game forced American officials to leave the dock.

"I think it's pretty clear that the people who don't want the (democratic) process to go forward are a small, violent minority."

U.N. envoy Dante Caputo said the army had "exclusive responsibility" for the protest. "We believed its commitment was real. But no," Caputo told reporters at the U.S. Embassy.

Susan Bolch, a member of the American Association of University Women, said the most important finding is that four out of five students have experienced sexual harassment.

The survey, which examined 1,632 public school children at 78 schools throughout the United States, also found that women suffer the most detrimental effects, such as a loss of self-esteem when they are sexually harassed. Bolch said sexual harassment girls to doubt if they can graduate and makes them reluctant to return to school.

In the survey, sexual harassment included sexually offensive comments, jokes, rumors, messages on bathroom walls and the blocking of someone's path.

Once someone gets to a college or university, Bolch said harassment is harder to detect, but still present.

"I think there is sexual harassment, but I think it is done in more subtle ways," she said. Texas A&M defines sexual harassment as "a form of misconduct and abuse that subjects an individual to sexually offensive conduct, sexual demands involving any kind of promise of threat or other offensive verbal, visual or physical conduct or activity of a sexual nature."

According to A&M policy, sexual harassment includes offering someone a good grade or special treatment for sexual favors, repeated sexual comments or questions that are offensive to the person being harassed, unwanted touching, repeated staring in a suggestive way, belittling nicknames based on gender or sexual orientation, disparity in treatment based on gender or sexual orientation and unwanted exposure to sexually suggestive materials.

For a person who feels they may have been sexually harassed, three University contacts are available:

- in the case of sexual harassment by students, contact Dr. Jim Winniford, vice president for student services.
 - in regards to sexual harassment by faculty members, contact Dr. William Perry, dean of faculties and associate provost.
 - to report sexual harassment by staff members, contact George Wharton, assistant executive director of human resources.
- Winniford said people who feel they have been sexually harassed should take advantage of the options available to them.
