Undergraduate Student Requirements:

- You must be a **degree seeking student** and have a **minimum of 95 credit hours**. (Completed in the summer of '93 or before.) Please keep in mind when calculating your hours that if you have repeated a previously passed course(s), you **cannot** receive additional credit hours. (Transfer hours completed in the summer of '93 or before that are needed to meet the 95 credit hour requirement, must be posted to your transcript by the deadline.)
- 30 of your 95 credit hours must be completed in residence at A&M.** In the event you left A&M for (5) or more consecutive Fall and Spring semesters, you must complete 30 consecutive credit hours at A&M **after your readmittance** to meet the resident hour requirement.
- You must have a **2.0 cumulative** grade point ratio at A&M.
- You must be in good standing with the University, including no blocks for delinquent parking tickets, past due fees, etc.

Graduate Student Requirements:

- You must receive your graduate degree from Texas A&M University to qualify for a ring. If you are graduating this **December** and **all of your degree requirements have been completed**, you may order your ring on this order if you can obtain a **"Letter Of Completion"** from the Office of Graduate Studies and present it to the Ring Office by the above deadline. (Must present the original letter with the seal, not a copy.)
- You must be in good standing with the University, including no blocks for delinquent parking tickets, past due fees, etc.

Procedure to order a ring:

- If you have completed all of the above requirements, come to the Ring Office **no later than October 21, 1993** and complete the application for eligibility verification. (Overnight process)
- If your application is approved and you wish to receive your ring this December, you must come back and pay in full (cash/check only) **no later than October 22, 1993.**

have made and asked students to stop and tell him if he says something offensive," she said. Dr. William L. Perry, associate provost and dean of faculties, sent a memo to all deans and directors of libraries Oct. 5 reminding faculty of University policy concerning what should be said in the classroom.

"Some reports of the use of classroom time by faculty to espouse personal religious viewpoints have come my way," he said in the memo. "Such conduct can have a negative impact on some students and impede the learning process."

"Respect for our students includes being aware of the diverse religions ascribed to, not to mention atheism or agnosticism," Perry said. "Espousal of individual religious beliefs in the classroom run counter to that respect."

"As a faculty member, we have a responsibility to teach what is listed as the course description in the University catalog," he said.

The academic freedoms and responsibilities of faculty are spelled out in the University's Policies and Procedures Manual: "Faculty members should maintain respect for the student and for the student's role as a learner. Each faculty member is entitled to full freedom in the classroom in discussing the subject being taught however, a faculty member should be judicious in the use of controversial material in the classroom."

Rabbi Peter Tarlow of the Hillel Foundation met with a number of non-Christian professors

Monday to write a letter supporting Perry's memo.

"I hope the memo will be effective," he said. "I would like to believe we are dealing with rational people here."

Tarlow said there have been problems with several departments.

"To stand in front of a classroom and tell your beliefs to the class is completely wrong," he said. "This is simply a mix of church and state. I guess some people don't realize this."

Perry asked deans to inform department heads about this issue and to contact him if they receive any complaints.

"If a student believes that there is a problem with instruction of a course, then they need to bring it to the attention of the administration. The administration can only act on a first hand basis," he said.

He said that if he receives complaints, he and the department head will investigate the situation.

"Any time you are talking about speech in a classroom, you are dealing with the first amendment, this is dealt with case by case," he said.

"The bid is the guide of what we will do if we get the conference," Remmler said. "It's a rough estimate of how things are going to be."

Member schools within A&M's region, which include Arkansas, Oklahoma, Louisiana, and Texas, will vote on the proposal.

The conference would bring 900 people from the Southwest Conference, and the southwest region of the National Affiliation of College and University Residence Halls to the Texas A&M campus next November.

"The conference would be two days of programming to see what other schools are doing and to get new ideas," McNulty said. "It also gives the advisers an opportunity to mingle and exchange ideas."

McNulty said that A&M would benefit from the exposure of the conference, as will local hotels and restaurants who will see a financial profit from the visiting schools.

Remmler said the conference would be a lot of work, but would also be a lot of fun for a lot of people.

"We want the whole university to be involved," Remmler said. "This is definitely not restricted on-campus students."

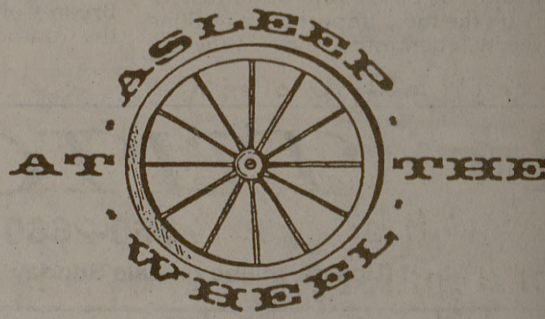
McNulty said the proposal had received a great deal of support locally from both the administration and RHA members.
