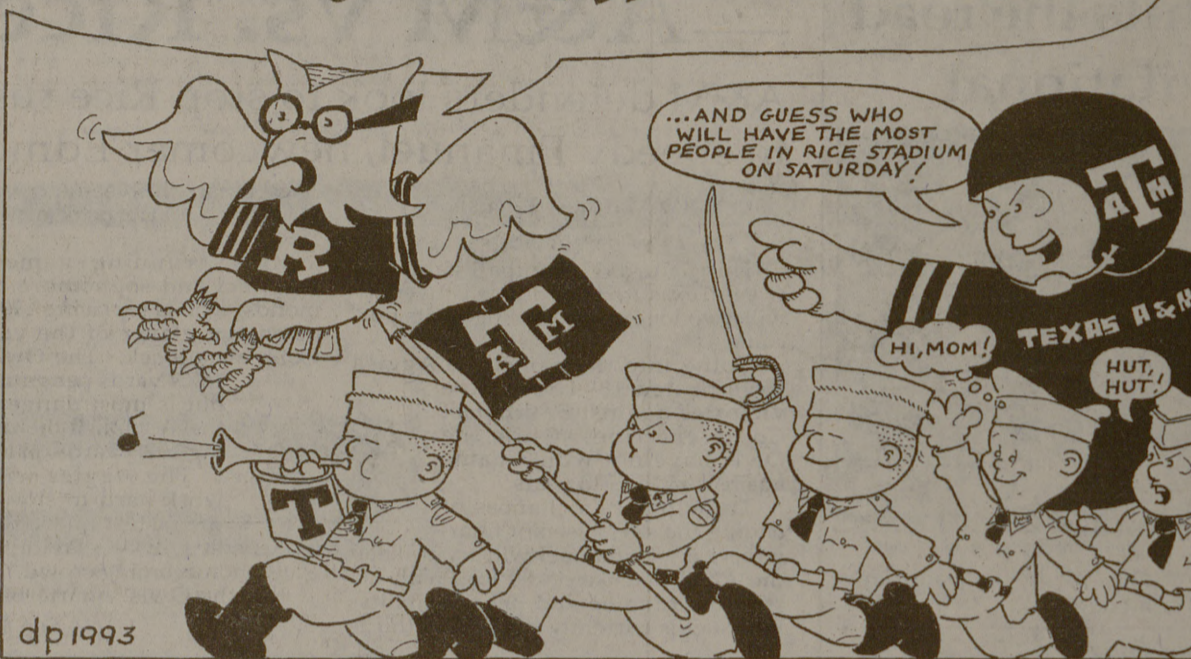

that statistics are not a very important part of the game. "If the team's doing well, that's all that really matters," Wente said. "I don't really worry about statistics too much, (because) statistics are just things that show that you've been doing your job." After winning one state championship and playing in three state tournaments at Clark High School in San Antonio, Wente said she found the transition from high school to college volleyball a bit surprising. "College volleyball is so different; it's such a fast-paced game," Wente said. "You've got six fundamentally sound players out there. "In high school, it was more of a situation where a couple of players are really good, a couple are mediocre and so on." The tempo change did not restrain Wente from being named 1992 SWC Newcomer of the Year, an award that earned her high praise from Lady Aggie head coach Laurie Corbelli. Corbelli said that in A&M's high-paced offense, Wente makes

it work with talent and diligence. "Suzy is a steady force for this team, and she has a strong winning attitude," Corbelli said. "She has a good feel of how to distribute the ball, and I feel like, with experience, she can become the top setter in the conference." For the conference, A&M's victory over Tech gave the Lady Aggies their first five match win total over SWC opponents since 1984. A&M is beating their opponents in hitting average, comparable to a baseball team's batting average, .259 to .166 overall. In conference, A&M's hitting advantage has been shaved to .169 versus their conference opponents' .114 percentage. The team's 21-4 record is A&M's best start since 1984 when the team finished 34-4. Although the Aggies have surprised a lot of people with their red-hot start this season, Wente said she thinks the talent to win has been there all along and now everything has come together. "We have a lot of different people that can hit well, jump well, and play defense well," Wente said. "I think we've been doing really awesome so far." "Everybody's playing their positions really well, and everyone's working as hard as they can in practice."

playing in front of the A&M defense, which is ranked nationally fourth in total defense (249.8 yards allowed per game) and eighth in scoring defense (12.8 points allowed per game). A&M junior wide receiver Brian Mitchell said that he knows Emanuel is the catalyst for Rice's offense, but he said that A&M is going into the game with the same outlook it always does. "I feel like he (Emanuel) can break open any game, but we're going to approach it like we would any other game," Mitchell said. "We don't really concern ourselves with how the other team is doing or how good they are." "We feel like if we go out and do the things we're supposed to do, we can win the game." Junior outside linebacker Antonio Shorter, who ranks third on the team in tackles with 42, said that Emanuel's skill is of concern, but can be shut down. "Bert is just like anybody else," Shorter said. "If you corner him, there is nowhere else to run. It doesn't matter who you are, you can't get away." Shorter said that if he gets help from his fellow defenders, he will not hesitate to make a big play, but also said that there is a certain hesitation when trying to defend a speedy quarterback such as Emanuel. "If it is me and him one on one, I'm going to settle down, try to just throttle and feed him, and let him make the decision," Shorter

said. Shorter said good reaction will be the key to containing Emanuel's game. "If a play comes down where it is me and some of (defensive) linemen chasing I'm going to try and go for gusto," Shorter said. "But I have to be both cautious and relentless because if you're too cautious, he's going to misuse you." "And you don't want to be misused." Senior defensive end Eric England said that he is wary of Emanuel's mobility, as well. "He presents a big threat. I'm really concerned about his speed," England said. "This is he's a senior, and he's hungry." England also said that the Aggies have plans to make Emanuel think twice about running with the ball. "Whenever he tries to run, we will be sure to put a lick on him," England said. "If we do that, he'll stay in the pocket and be more apprehensive about coming out there." Forgotten in much of the talk about Emanuel's ability and quickness, however, is Edmonds, who has quietly rushed for 700 yards, ranking him second on the SWC. Shorter said that the Aggies cannot overlook Edmonds and other offensive weapons the Owl will use to complement Emanuel. "You can't forget about the other skill guys," Shorter said. "The other man skill guys are very good and like Bert will put six points on the board." "They'll put six points on the board, really fast."

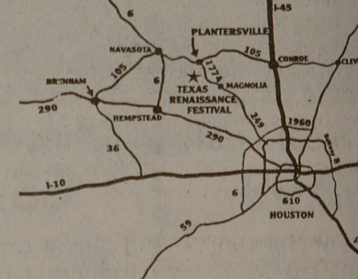
